The Medical Roundup

Many persons wonder if anything can be done to make their world and wet hands warmer and drier... They wonder why Nature gave them such hands. I have known some secretaries who could hardly work in an office because with their wet hands they soiled the paper on which they were writing. Such hands are found practically always in the cases of very tense, nervous persons, and the trouble is due to too great an activity of the nerves that supply the blood vessels and sweat glands in the arms. If only such a person could become calm and happy and free from terrible tension he or she could probably have a dry and warm hand.

Years ago the doctors at the Mayo Clinic called in nerve anatomists from as far away as England, and with their help eventually located some "sympathetic" nerves up in the neck which could be cut. With this operation the hands could be made warm and dry. But the operation proved to be a difficult one; it did not always work well, and sometimes the patient was left with much pain in his arms. For this reason it has not been much used. A similar operation which makes the feet warm is much less tricky and hence is commonly performed. In this operation sympathetic nerves back of the abdomen are cut and removed.

Drug Doesn't Work
Many drugs have been tried in an effort to make the hands warm and dry, and occasionally I have seen a report in a medical journal to the effect that a doctor has found such a drug. Unfortunately, when I have tried the drug on my patients with wet hands, it has not worked.

Some of those many persons who suffer from cold feet also have a tense erratic nervous system. Mrs. Raverat, who is a granddaughter of the famous Charles Darwin, tells in her very interesting recent book, "Period Piece" that the sons of Charles Darwin inherited his tense sensitive nervous system and suffered much as he did from cold feet. They all slept with big woolen socks on.

Some persons with very cold hands suffer from the Raynaud syndrome. In this, one or more fingers may turn perfectly white and may then hurt and even become blistered or ulcerated. Persons with this trouble nat-

Chicago Confederate Bombing Postponed

Oxford, Miss. — (U.P.) — A persistent southern disk jockey said today he is going ahead with new plans to bomb Chicago with 25,000 confederate flags on Friday.

Israel Will Ask US For Definite Answer

Washington (U.P.) — Israel today was reported preparing to ask the United States this week for a flat yes or no answer on its request to buy \$64,000,000 worth of U. S. arms.

Israeli sources said the Israeli government feels the United States has had ample time to reach a decision on the arms request. Israel submitted its four months ago orally and more than three months ago in writing.

Israel contends it needs the arms to counter recent arms shipments to Arab nations from Iron Curtain countries.

Portland Notes Eight February Road Deaths

Portland — (U.P.) — The number of traffic fatalities in Portland for February rose to eight yesterday with the death of 54-year-old Ora Elmer Boyles. Boyles was injured in a two-car crash last Friday on the city's northwest St. Helens road.

The death of Boyles ran the Portland toll for February of this year higher than it has been for any single month since December 1954 when eight persons were killed in the Christmas traffic of the city.

It was the 13th fatality of the year for Portland, six more than for the same period of last year. Last February there were no traffic fatalities in the city.

British Airman Told To Hide Wife's Photo

Brentford, England — (U.P.) — A British airman has been told to keep his wife's picture hidden during duty hours because it "might take the minds of airmen off their work."

Leading Aircraftman Ted Collins was told to take his wife Maureen's picture off the wall at his base. She is a model and measures 43-24-38.
