

### Space Travel May Cause Hair To Turn Gray; Stay-Behinds May Age Faster

San Francisco —(U.P.)—Space travelers may get grayer hair than people who stay on earth, but they probably won't age so fast.

That's what a couple of scientists told a University of California symposium on space problems the other night. The symposium honored Robert Gordon Sproul, who is celebrating his 25th year as president of UC.

Nello Pace, associate professor of Physiology on the Berkeley campus, said Einstein's theory of relativity will come into play when the speed of a space ship gets within 90 per cent of the speed of light.

**Time Will Expand**  
That means that when a space ship approaches 186,000 miles a second, not only mass but time will expand. Hence, the time

scale of our earth may be different from that on a space ship. "My guess," Pace said, "is that within 20 years, somebody is going to be out there beyond the reach of gravity and then we may have a chance to find out. "For all that any scientist

### Joint Session Hears Gronchi

Washington —(U.P.)—Italian President Giovanni Gronchi addresses a joint session of Congress today in one of the highlights of his historic goodwill visit to the United States.

He was expected to outline his views on world problems and stress the importance of Italian-American relations to the free world.

The 68-year-old Italian chief of state will be guest of honor at a dinner given tonight by Secretary of State John Foster Dulles.

Gronchi, first Italian chief of state ever to visit the United States, conferred Tuesday with President Eisenhower. The two stressed the importance of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and discussed ways to strengthen it.

Gronchi expects to have a second meeting with Mr. Eisenhower before leaving Washington but no time for it has been set yet. At that conference, the outspoken Gronchi likely will have some suggestions about what the United States can do to encourage European integration, one of the key goals of American foreign policy.

knows today, it may be possible to travel several years in space at great velocities and return, having aged less than the people on earth."

**Grey Hair Likely**  
But Dr. Herman B. Chase of Brown University warned that space travelers may return with slightly grayer hair "and even possibly the loss of an occasional hair follicle."

He based his prediction on a study of rats sent up to 95,000 feet in a balloon. He said cosmic ray radiation caused their fur to become gray or spotted with white.

Space flight can cause a "minor increase" in greying of hair, Chase concluded, but whether more serious damage occurs and can be detected "is still in question."

### Construction of New Tire Plant to Start

Construction was expected to start today on a new \$31,000 building at 1116 Court st. to house Hawkinson Tire Tread service.

### Elisworth Reports On Appropriation Measures' Progress

Washington, D.C.—(Special) — Every year, Congress must enact 13 regular annual appropriation bills plus two or three supplemental appropriation bills. There is usually at least one measure called an urgent deficiency appropriation bill.

While this session of Congress has not handled much other legislation thus far, it has made an all time record for speed in getting out the first of the regular money bills. The House has passed two and sent them to the Senate. Before this letter appears in print, another will have been acted upon. Already passed are the "Treasury-Post Office" bill, and the one for the "Department of Interior and Related Agencies." Next will be a catch-all bill called "General Government Matters" which will be followed in a few days by bills for Health Education and Welfare Department and for the so-called "Independent Offices" which bill includes money for the numerous government commissions such as the Interstate Commerce Commission and the Federal Communications Commission.

Several items in the bill for the Department of Interior and related agencies are of particular interest to us. That bill provides money for the Forest Service and for the Bureau of Land Management (O&C Administration). Some substantial increases were given the Forest Service. An additional \$1,600,000 is provided for preparing timber sales; \$470,000 more will step up care of camp grounds and \$465,250 more will provide improvements on the Forests. The bill included the full authorization of \$24,000,000 for Forest Service access roads, and \$4,460,000 for access roads on O&C lands.

It should be noted, however, that the access road money for the O&C lands is really not a Federal appropriation at all. It is money which the counties are entitled to receive under the O&C law but which they have agreed should be spent for access roads so that the proper level of timber harvest on the lands can be maintained.

At long last, the necessity for a good construction program for forest timber access roads is becoming recognized both by the members of the Appropriations committee and by the Committee on Highways. The first big "break through" was in the Highway Act of 1954 when the authorization for such roads was increased to \$24,000,000 and made on a three year basis. That sum has actually been appropriated each of the three years. The 1954 authorization has now run out. It will be necessary to have an access roads authorizing section in the big highway construction bill which will be up for final consideration soon.

I have discussed the timber access road problem with the chairman of the Highways subcommittee and have written all members of that committee setting forth my views. I guess I am not much of a politician, because in attempting to work this problem out with the Committee, I have used sound reasonable figures as worked out by the Forest Service. In other words, a careful survey reveals that \$25,000,000 a year for five years will provide roads enough to bring the forest cut up to the sustained yield capacity. That is about the amount of money that can be efficiently expended. So that is my recommendation.

He has to go until 7:12 a.m. Thursday to beat the more than 67-hour record set by Sam Ulano, the Bronx, N.Y., drum teacher and free lance drummer.

Rogers, 26, had one setback crop up Tuesday, but it hasn't stopped his drumming. The finance company took his car away for missing a payment.

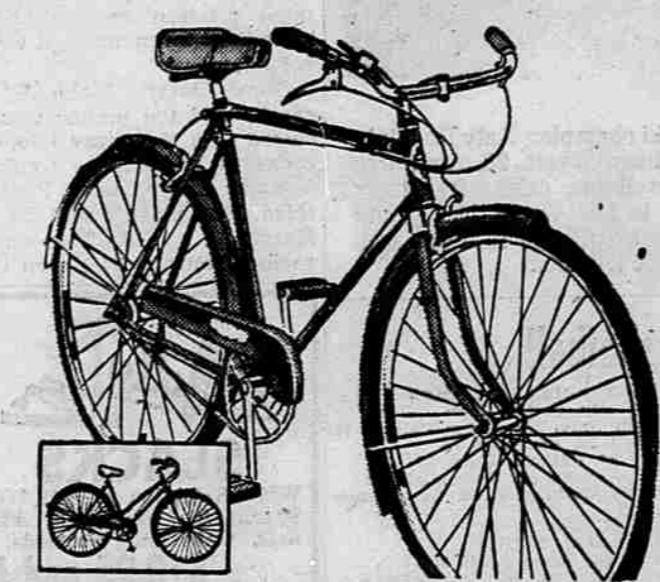
