The Medical Roundup

Heredity

Although I get some letters from persons who resent my mention of a poor nervous heredity as a cause of nervousness, I get, also, many a kind and helpful letter from persons who say "You just go on talking about heredity; you are dead right; I ought to know, with the family I have!" I recently received an interesting letter from an able, keen woman who, she says, has some bad days when she gets to "wring her hands in an agony of nervousness." At times it is so bad she can hardly stand it, and then she has to go out and walk and walk until she is tired enough to quiet down. Also she has terrible headaches.

Where did she get all this. She says she got it mainly from her father who once had to go into a mental hospital. A brother of her father, also, had several spells which required treatment in a mental hospital. Another brother had stomach ulcers and eventually got to drinking heavily, and another brother took to the bottle. A sister is well. The reason three out of four were hit so hard is probably that some mental trouble came also from the mother's side. The mother and one of the mother's sisters spent years in a mental hospital.

The writer says, "My sister and I were told years ago that insanity is never inherited, and I think this untruth helped us in that, for a time, it diminished our fear of mental disease. Today we know that mental disease is definitely inherited and so we have rejected the old lie. We are now facing facts resolutely; we are trying to live sanely, and we are trying to raise our children so sensibly that they can grow up into good and sane citizens.

I pray with this fine woman and her sister that they may succeed. Even with a bad nervous heredity, a person does not have to crack-up. It helps tremendously to live sanely and to cling to one's sanity. It can help greatly to consult a kind and able psychiatrist. Oftentimes the new sedative drugs help, and often, as when a person is badly depressed, it helps to have a few electroshock treatments.

Tapeworms

Quite a few persons have a tapeworm and do not know it. One cannot blame a physician for not thinking of this disease and examining for it, because so few North Americans harbor these worms. They are far more common in certain countries where beef, pork, and certain fishes are eaten raw, just smoked or almost uncooked.

The two commonest tapeworms live in the bowels of cattle and hogs. Little cysts, from which the adult worms can grow and scatter throughout the muscles (meat) of the animal. If a man eats such a cyst in which the parasite has not been killed by cooking he is likely soon to have a tapeworm in his bowel. A high percentage of dogs and cats have tapeworms but they are not of the type that grow in the bowel of man.

The surest way to avoid getting a tapeworm is not to eat almost-raw hamburger or sausage. The Finns, who like to eat raw fish, often get in their bowel a bad type of tapeworm which causes a severe anemia.

It is hard to say what symptoms are produced by a tapeworm. Probably in most cases there are no symptoms that can be recognized. Usually the person involved must make the diagnosis by noting in the toilet

Collagen Diseases

People keep asking me. What is a collagen disease? There are a group of fortunately rare diseases in which a number of parts of the body are injured. Apparently the basic trouble is some disturbance with one of the tissues that lines the arteries. If the injured arteries are found mainly in the skin, the person may have lupus erythematosus, a serious disease of the skin. Associated with this there may be marked changes in the heart, the kidneys, and other organs of the body.

Fortunately, today, many of the patients with this type of trouble can be treated over crises—such as used often to be fatal. The person can be helped much by cortisone or one of the related drugs, or by one of the synthetic anti-malaria drugs.
