Divorce Cases Have No Innocent Victim
Many men find divorce a great handicap.

(Q) "I was very much interested in your recent column about the divorced man who was afraid to ask girls for dates for fear they would not want to go out with a man who was divorced. It touched me because it has happened to me many times. I was divorced three years ago because my wife wanted to marry someone else. Since then I have found that the nice girls don't want to have dates with me. Their parents seem to feel that as I made a failure of my first marriage, I am not eligible. As my family has lived in this neighborhood all their lives, the people I know all know about my divorce and my wife's marriage. The girls who will go out with me are not the sort I would want to marry. I feel I as the innocent victim of this divorce and should not be penalized in this way."

(A) There is never an "innocent victim" in any divorce, though it is true one partner is usually more to blame than the other. Even if you tried to make a go of your marriage and did all you could to make your wife happy, there must have been something you did to make her want to leave you for another man.

True, all you may have done was to choose the wrong type of girl. But few people will think of that as the cause of your divorce. There is a fairly universal belief that the man is always to blame, one way or another, when his wife wants to leave him.

More Likely To Be Critical
Because the people you know have known you, your family and your wife, they are more likely to be critical of your divorce than strangers would be. They are apt to take sides with you or your wife, depending on whether they like you or her.

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Roseburg Attorney Jailed for Contempt

Roseburg—(U.P.)—Roseburg Attorney Spencer W. Yates was jailed here Monday on a one-day sentence for contempt of court imposed by Circuit Judge Carl E. Wimberley.

It was the first time in the legal history of Douglas county that an attorney had been found in contempt and sentenced to a jail term.

The contempt proceeding stemmed from a personal injury damage suit in Judge Wimberley's court last Wednesday. At that time the court reprimanded a witness for evasive answers.

Yates, an attorney for the plaintiff in the civil action, said "I object to the court's irascible tone."

Today Judge Wimberley said "I consider the word 'irascible' to be insolent, contemptuous and deliberately premeditated."

He offered to allow Yates to make a public retraction and apology but the attorney refused and was remanded to the sheriff for imprisonment.

Hope Said Dimming For Tax Reduction

Washington—(U.P.)—House Republican Leader Joseph W. Martin Jr. says "hope is gradually dimming" for a tax cut this year.

He blamed Democratic additions to President Eisenhower's budget.

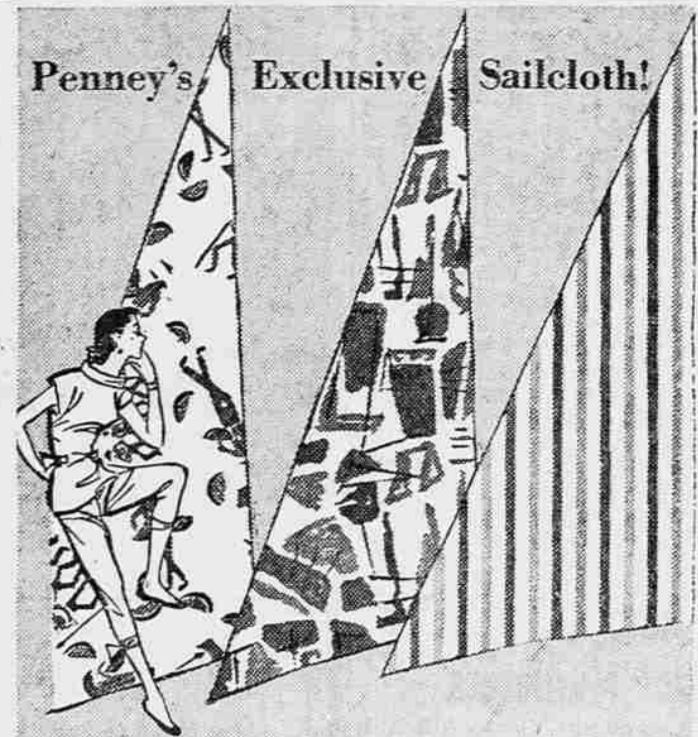
Martin told the United Press Sunday—the 31st anniversary of his membership in the House—that "at the start of this session of Congress I was quite hopeful there could be a tax cut."

"But that hope is gradually dimming," the Massachusetts Republican declared.

He said the Democratic-controlled House Appropriations Committee may have set some kind of a precedent Friday when it added \$154,000,000 to Mr. Eisenhower's budget requests on two big money bills.

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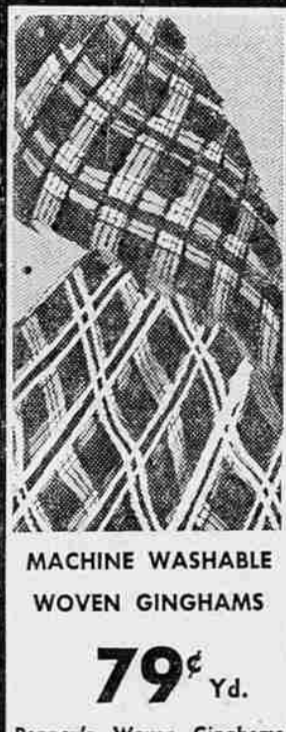

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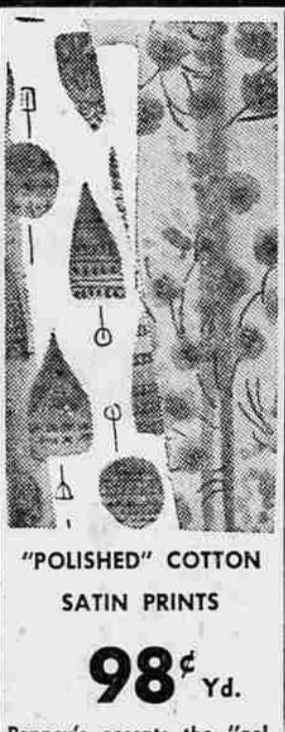
