

Morehead State Gets NCAA Berth

Morehead State, highest scoring major college basketball team in the nation, today became the 25th and last team to enter the field for the NCAA tournament.

The Morehead Eagles became the Ohio Valley Conference representative in the tourney Thursday night by nipping Western Kentucky, 84-80, in the final game of a special playoff. They qualified to meet Marshall of Huntington, W. Va., in a first-round tourney game at Fort Wayne, Ind., March 12.

Morehead, Western Kentucky, and Tennessee Tech had finished the season in a three-way tie for the Ohio Valley title.

Western Kentucky downed Tech by the same 84-80 score Wednesday in the first game of the play-off.

Phil Woolpert Mentor of Year

New York (U.P.)—Phil Woolpert, whose San Francisco Dons parlayed his defensive tactics into the longest winning streak in major college basketball history, today was chosen United Press Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

Woolpert, who concentrated on defense again this season while most coaches stressed offenses that boosted scoring to all-time highs, was elected in a nationwide poll of 319 sports writers and broadcasters.

The slim, 40-year-old Woolpert received a remarkably high total of 128 votes, considering that 38 coaches figured in the balloting. He is the first coach to win the poll two consecutive seasons.

Harry Combes of Illinois was second with 26 votes. Frank McGuire of North Carolina was next with 23 and Tom Blackburn of Dayton was fourth with 20.

Earlier this week, San Francisco was voted the nation's No. 1 team for the second successive year by the United Press Board of Coaches and Bill Russell and Cpt. K. C. Jones of the Dons won All-America berths on the United Press team.

AAU Region Tiff Set for Albany

Albany, Ore.—(U.P.)—Albany's AAU basketball team, champion of Oregon, meets the strong Eberle Builders of Spokane here tomorrow night. The winner will meet the Buchanan Baker team of Seattle for a berth in the national AAU tournament at Denver.

DONS PLACE RUSSELL, JONES ON ALL-COAST; NAULLS, BOIN PICKED

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The Pacific Coast conference and the national champion University of San Francisco Dons split up all the places on the 1956 United Press All-West coast basketball team selected today with the aid of sports writers and coaches.

As expected, big Bill Russell and ace play-maker K.C. Jones of the Dons were on the squad; and the other three were Willie (The Whale) Naulls of the PCC champion UCLA Bruins; sensational sophomore Bruno (Bong) Boin of Washington; and little team director George Selleck of Stanford.

Four members of the squad were just about unanimous choices, but Selleck barely edged Morris Taft of the Bruins out for the fifth place.

Gambee on Second Five
Other than Selleck, it is a gigantic squad. The diminutive Stanford star is only 5-8. But the rest of the club ranges from 6-2 for Jones to 6-10 for Russell, with Boin at 6-8; and Naulls at 6-5.

Each of the men on the first team gained recognition as a driving force in a good season for his school.

The second team also was made up of men all from the PCC or the California Basketball association. On this team are Dave Gambee, Oregon State; Bob Blake, California; Morrie Taft of UCLA; Harry Perry of USC; and Larry Beck of Washington State.

The third team was composed of Tony Pinkins, San Diego State; Odell Johnson, St. Mary's; Larry Robinson, California; Barry Brown, Stanford; and John Thomas, College of Pacific.

Jerry Kesselring Leads Pensacola First Round

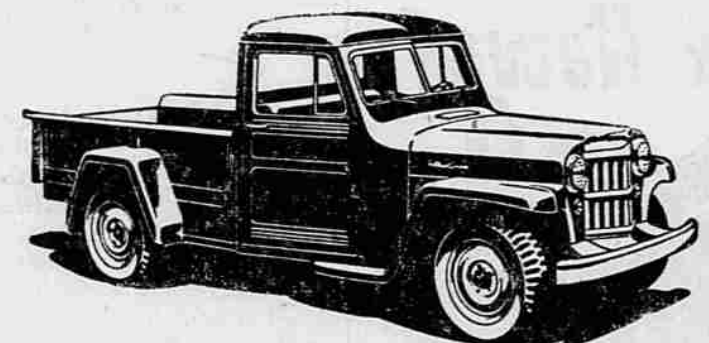

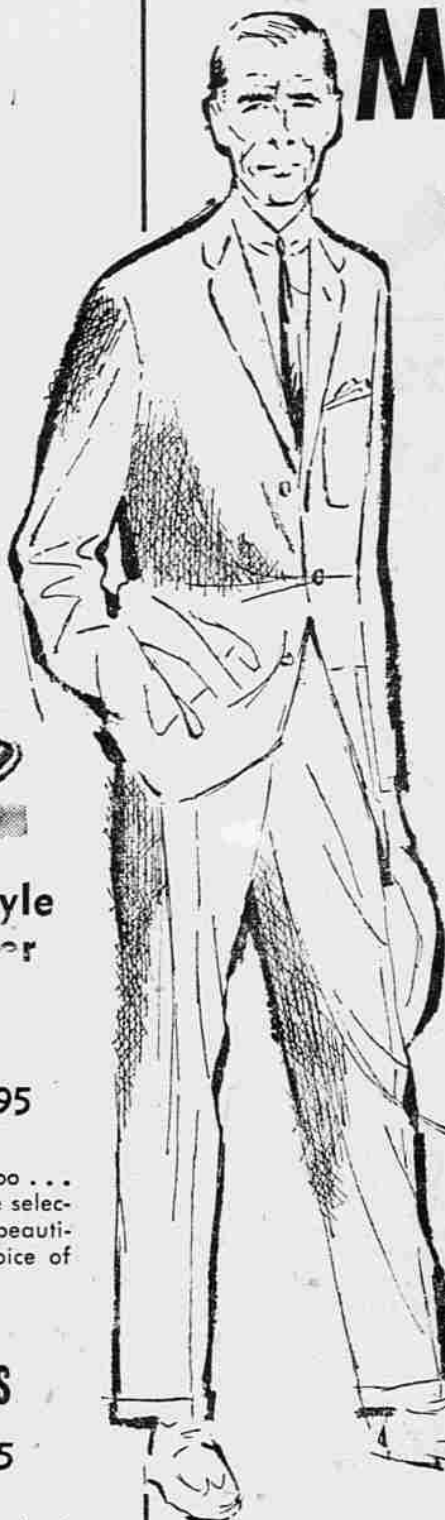
