San Luis Obispo, Calif. — (U.P.) — Defending champion Oregon State, with 12 points, held the lead Saturday going into the second round of the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate Wrestling tournament.
Tourney favorite University of Oregon was second in first-round matches with nine points, followed by San Jose with eight.
Among Friday winners was Dave Newland, Oregon's defending coast champion in the 147-

pound class. He defeated Lou Taucher, Oregon State, by a 4-1 decision in nine minutes to go into the Saturday semi-finals.
First round scoring of other schools was UCLA 7, San Diego State 5, Washington State 5, Portland State 3, University of California 2, Lewis and Clark 1 and Stanford 1. Cal Poly of San Luis Obispo, Western University and Santa Clara all failed to score in the opening round.

University Purchases French Manuscript

Eugene — A rare old French manuscript, one of the last remaining not in other libraries or collections, will be presented to the University of Oregon library March 11.

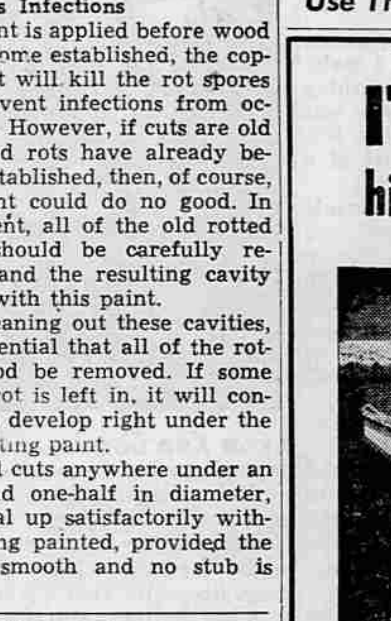
AMATEURS ONLY

Garden Notes

Protecting large cuts on trees from rot is essential in maintaining a healthy tree with a large trunk and branches. The first step in the prevention of the entrance of wood rot is to make a good clean cut close to the trunk or main limb so that no stub is left.
This cut surface should be allowed to weather for a month or two and then treated with a good fungicidal paint. A good paint can be made by mixing 2 pounds of Venetian Red and 2/3 pound of Fixed Copper in a pint of raw linseed oil. This will make a stiff paint which should be applied with a stiff bristled brush so that the paint is thoroughly worked into the cracks and crevices.
Prevents Infections
If paint is applied before wood rot becomes established, the copper in it will kill the rot spores and prevent infections from occurring. However, if cuts are old ones and rot has already become established, then, of course, the paint could do no good. In this event, all of the old rotted wood should be carefully removed and the resulting cavity coated with this paint.
In cleaning out these cavities, it is essential that all of the rotted wood be removed. If some of the rot is left in, it will continue to develop right under the weathering paint.
Small cuts anywhere under an inch and one-half in diameter, will heal up satisfactorily without being painted, provided the cut is smooth and no stub is left.



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3,000 Producer Tags Distributed in Area
More than 3,000 producer tags have been distributed in southern Oregon in the last six months as the result of a new requirement making meat dealers and locker plant operators responsible for untagged meat carcasses in their possession.
Guy Hughes, district representative for the state department of agriculture animal division, reported that tags are available to farmers in Josephine and Jackson counties at the sheriff's office, Medford and Grants Pass; Brand Inspector Joseph L. Rose, 1250 Leonard rd., Grants Pass; Inspector Ben George, Cave Junction; Inspector Sterling Fryrear, 75 Dewey st., Ashland; Chief of Police William J. Peters, Rogue River; Deputy Sheriff Les Titcomb, Cave Junction; Deputy Sheriff Roy Long, Shady Cove; and at 101 North Ivy st., Medford.
