PATERNITY SUITS AND BLOOD TESTS

It is sad but rather to be expected that some judges in the United States have been slow to believe blood experts when they say that their battery of tests for blood grouping they can state positively that a certain man accused of being the father of a child could not possibly have been the other day I read that a few years ago even the U.S. Supreme Court upheld the refusal of a trial court to order a blood test on the grounds that scientists had not yet agreed as to the significance of these tests. But things are changing, and of late many courts have faced the fact that one inherits one's blood characteristics as exactly according to laws as one inherits one's black hair or blue eyes.

In Dr. Reed's interesting recent book on genetics, he says that, according to the tests, Charlie Chaplin could not possibly have sired the child that he was accused of fathering. But the jury went ahead and decided against the facts. A point that should be re-

membered is that these blood tests do not show that a man is the father of a certain child. They show either that he could not have been the father, or that it would be mighty hard to find in the whole state another man with such blood groupings as the putative father had—hence he probably was the father.

Dormant Spray Need For Apple, Pear Trees

Dormant sprays on apple and pear trees should be applied as soon as possible for control of San Jose scale, blister mite, pear psylla and European red mite, Don Berry, county horticultural agent said yesterday.

The spray should be applied by both home and commercial growers, Berry said. He recommended spraying 12 gallons of liquid lime and sulphur or 18 pounds of polysulphide plus 10 gallons of dormant oil emulsion per acre for commercial growers.

Berry recommended that home gardeners use one quart of liquid lime and sulphur or one-half pound of polysulphide to three gallons of water.
