The Medical Roundup

THE HEREDITY OF CRIMINALS

So many of my readers resent my occasional mention of the tremendous importance of heredity in making us human beings, what we are, and so many psychiatrists follow the present-day fad of never even mentioning the inheritance of mental quirks, that I feel I must keep educating people in regard to this topic. I just saw in Time (Jan. 30) a vivid short sermon on the subject.

For killing a policeman, Hurbie Fairries Jr., was recently electrocuted in Oklahoma. When Hurbie was 16 months old, an uncle of his in Texas was electrocuted for murdering a prison guard. A few years later Hurbie's mother, who had early left his father, shot and killed her second husband. Later, for good measure, she killed her third husband, Hurbie's brother is doing 10 years for burglary, and his uncle, a habitual criminal, is in for life. Even Hurbie's girl friend is in jail for stealing cars and taking them into Virginia for sale. Just before Hurbie went to the chair, his father, a burglar, was released under police escort to go to the Governor and plead for leniency for his son.

I know that many people will write to me that the boy's troubles were all due to broken home, or to imitation, but they will forget that the father was divorced when the lad was born and it is not stated that the boy lived with either one of his criminal uncles. Careful German studies of the genetics of criminals have shown that usually a considerable percentage of the uncles of criminals, who lived perhaps in another city, were criminal. This means that the nephew often got his criminality, not through training or imitation, but apparently through inheritance of anti-social traits.

Because so often the habitual criminal is an antisocial, somewhat psychotic person who can never settle down to work for a living, he should not be given six months for a small theft and ten years for a big one. He should be taken care of by the state or nation—often for life. The idea should not be to punish him for the rare crime in which he gets caught, but to protect merchants and insurance carriers from the staggering costs that they now carry due to the daily depredations of our criminal group.

If our business men had more sense they might join together and support in comfort all known burglars. Why? Because it would be so much cheaper. Now, when a burglar steals \$50,000 worth of furs he gets so little for them from a "fence" and he has to contribute so much of these proceeds to "friends" who will keep him out of jail, that a few weeks later he has to go out again to steal more furs. I really suspect it would be much cheaper for the furriers to combine and supply the thief with an apartment and a monthly allowance so that he could rest at home and perhaps retire from his business of stealing.

Some benighted person will doubtless write to me asking, "But why not put him in jail?" First, he must be caught and that costs much money; then he will have to be prosecuted at great expense; then, if convicted and jailed, he must for a few years be supported at great expense by the state. And soon he will be out again, stealing more furs.

Some may ask, "what is a doctor doing, talking about crime?" In the first place: The habitual criminal is often mentally ill to some extent; he is a case for a doctor or a psychiatrist. Second, I happen to have read some very interesting autobiographies of men who spent their lives stealing. They said that in order to stay in this sort of life, the habitual thief, who is usually well-known to the police, has to keep dividing his earnings 50-50 with certain people who will keep him out of jail. This is not my statement. It is the statement of professional thieves who ought to know.

Reclamation Bureau To Open Home Sites

Portland — (U.P.) — The bureau of reclamation will open 17 family-sized farm units to Homestead entry by veterans on the Kennewick division of the Yakima project in south central Washington, the Interior Department said Tuesday.

The lands to be homesteaded are located in Benton county, near the city of Kennewick, and are within the Kennewick irrigation district.

The farm units range in size from 71 to 135 irrigable acres for a total of 1,658 acres. While the lands are free to qualified homestead applicants — who must build a home and meet certain residence and cultivation requirements — the homesteader will pay his share of project construction costs over a period of years. Application blanks can be obtained from the Bureau of Reclamation office at Kennewick.

Buenos Aires Port Crippled by Strike

Buenos Aires — (U.P.) — Operations in the huge Buenos Aires port were crippled Monday by a 24-hour waterfront strike. Dock workers called the strike as a warning to employers who have ignored a demand for a daily minimum wage of \$4.44 a day.

Time Not Right to Increase Milk Prices

Portland — (U.P.) — H. S. Dixon, general manager of the Tillamook County Creamery Association, said Tuesday that the time is not right for an increase in milk prices in the Portland milk shed.

Some members of the Oregon Milk Producers voted Saturday to request an increase equivalent to one cent per quart from Portland Milk Distributors Association.

Most producer groups and distributors in Portland agreed with Dixon that an increase would be unwise at this time. They pointed out that although producers had been subjected to high hay costs during the long winter, there was a surplus of fluid milk in the Portland milk shed.

Dixon said "to increase prices at this time would react to discourage consumption and encourage production of more manufactured dairy products at a time when government purchases of surplus dairy products are heavy."

Italian President Cancels Site Tour

New York — (U.P.) — Italian President Giovanni Gronchi canceled a scheduled visit to the Brookhaven, N.Y., atomic laboratories Tuesday and remained in his hotel room because of a "slight indisposition."

Other members of Gronchi's party left for the Long Island atomic installation on schedule. The nature of Gronchi's "indisposition" was not made known, but he was believed suffering from the fatigue of his U. S. tour.
