Suggests Humans May Be Blamed for Hurricane Increase

Washington—(U.P.)—A scientist suggests that man himself may be partly to blame for the recent jump in the number of hurricanes that hit the East Coast.

This was brought out in testimony released today, at hearings before a House Appropriations Subcommittee on U.S. scientific plans for the 1957-58 International Geophysical Year (IGY).

Dr. Roger R. Revelle, director of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography in California, said IGY scientists will study the increasing carbon dioxide content of the atmosphere and the seas to determine its effect on climate.

Carbon Dioxide

Fuel-burning man is adding "tremendous quantities of carbon dioxide in the air," he said, and "lots of people" think this may "cause a remarkable change in climate" by raising atmospheric temperatures.

Revelle assured inquiring subcommittee members that carbon dioxide, a waste product of fuel burning, is not directly harmful to man and does not contribute to smog.

But "the increase in the number of hurricanes on the East Coast," he added, "is certainly tied in one way or the other with the general northward movement of the warm air."

The subcommittee was asked to put up \$28,000,000, in addition to \$12,000,000 already appropriated, to finance U.S. participation in the 55-nation IGY. This is a world-wide program to get new knowledge about the earth and space.

No Foul Play Seen In Death Plunge

Oregon City—(U.P.)—Sheriff Fred Reaksecker said today no evidence of foul play has been found in the 340-foot death plunge of Taylor Comer, 47-year-old log truck driver.

Comer's body was found Sunday at the foot of a 340-foot ravine at Lookout point near Estacada. "At this point we are inclined to think death was accidental," he said.

Lakeview—(U.P.)—Dial telephones will go into use in Lakeview and Paisley Sunday, West Coast Telephone company officials have announced. Some 1400 phones in the two towns will make the switch from manual to dial operation.

Marland Appointed to Succeed Sen. Kilgore

Charleston, W. Va.—(U.P.)—Gov. William C. Marland has appointed his state tax commissioner, William R. Laird, to fill temporarily the Senate seat left vacant by the death of Democratic Sen. Harley M. Kilgore. Laird, 39, will serve until a

permanent replacement is named for Kilgore in the November election. Laird said he will not seek election in November.

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
