# Lung Diseases Theme Of Hinshaw Speech

The regular dinner meeting of the association was held at Rogue Valley Country club. Dr. Hinshaw, former member of Mayo clinic medical staff, was introduced by Dr. Oscar Heyerman, who was also with the clinic.

Dr. Hinshaw stressed that routine chest x-rays are actually a part of a complete physical examination and the x-ray is only the first step in diagnosis. He also emphasized the importance of skin testing for tuberculosis as being a great aid in ruling out the disease.

Methods of establishing positive diagnosis to find the cause of abnormal shadows in the lung in chest x-rays also was explained by the speaker. Hosts were Dr. M. Donald McGeary, Phoenix, and Dr. James C. Luce.
