The Medical Roundup

ALLERGIC CHILD (Continued from Thursday) Dr. Clein says that the allergic child with an uncomfortable nose will often keep picking at it or rubbing his finger up and down against the tip. After every "cold" the child may wheeze for a time. He may feel tired and without pep, and he may have a headache. Food allergy commonly depresses and dulls the brain.



Years ago my friend, Dr. Clifford Sweet, an able pediatrician of Oakland, Calif., on hearing of my own "dull Monday," due to eating chicken (to which I am allergic) on Sunday, soon gathered together into a "Dumb Monday Club" a group of children who became dull after eating on Sunday some common allergy-producing food such as chicken, pork, chocolate, nuts, or egg-white, as in angel-food cake. In the worst cases the child, on Monday, was too dull to go to school. Allergic children can run a slight fever, and their stuffy nose can bring poor hearing. The chronic irritation of the nose can make an allergic child more than usually subject to bad colds and other respiratory infections. Before I knew about my food allergies I had four bad colds a year; now I rarely have one.

Dr. Clein says that if we physicians would only recognize allergies in children we would not take out so many tonsils and adenoids. He said that a family history of allergy can be found in some 90 per cent of cases of large tonsils. Allergic parents should be particularly on the watch for allergy in their children.

In my experience skin tests are seldom of much value in revealing allergy to food; they work better in revealing sensitivity to dusts, pollens, and animal emanations. If a grandchild of mine were suffering from what looked like a constant allergic misery I would have him eat and drink for a day or two nothing but (and I mean nothing but) lamb (broiled) with rice (cooked in water and served with only butter and sugar) and a canned pear for dessert. If, on this diet, the child were immediately to become bright and happy I would begin adding a new food each day, letting the mother keep notes as to which caused trouble and which did not. In this way we would soon know what the child could and could not eat.

If the child had a bad spell only once a week or so I would have the mother list the unusual foods eaten just before the distress came. After 3 or 4 or 5 spells it would be apparent that one special food was always eaten before distress came. Then, this

Eugene Voters Can Not Be Registered

Salem — (U.P.) — Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton said yesterday that the Lane county clerk should refuse to register any prospective voter applying for registration who is a resident of any precinct of Lane county within the city limits of Eugene during the period from now until March 28.

The city faces the unusual situation of having three consecutive elections — a city bond election, a school bond election and the regular primary election.

State election law provides that registration must close 30 days prior to all three elections for the persons involved, resulting in an unusually long closure for city voters. Thornton said in an opinion that "it is to be regretted that the right to register and the resultant right to vote... must be denied to what may be a large number of residents of the city of Eugene."
