The Medical Roundup

For 30 years diabetes, dependent on injections of insulin, have been hoping for a drug that may be taken by mouth. Until a few weeks ago there was little prospect of finding such a medicine. Thousands of patients were so averse to using the hated hypodermic needle that they sent money in large amounts to two renegade physicians in Indiana who advertised widely that they had an insulin-like drug that would work when taken by mouth. These men became millionaires, but eventually they were put in jail, where they belonged. As I remember, their "medicine" proved to be tap water. As one might have expected, thousands of people who put their trust in this supposed remedy paid for their foolishness with their lives. They would not listen to their good home doctor. Recently, in Germany, a drug was found, related to the sulfonamides, which when given by mouth, will lower the level of the blood sugar. According to Drs. Max Miller and James W. Craig, of Western Reserve University, the drug is not a substitute for insulin. It is not effective in cases of young diabetes, and it does not help in cases of acidosis due to a severe form of diabetes. It appears, however, that the drug can help the older, overweight diabetic. Often such persons have the rather mild form of diabetes which can come late in life. According to Dr. I. Arthur Mirsky, so far as can be told now, the drug appears to act by blocking the effect of a substance in the body which destroys insulin. Now, a search is on to find other substances with this action. Some of them might be better than the one that has already been found. Much work will now be done, also, to make certain that the new drug, when used every day for long periods of time, will not damage the liver or any other organ of the body. I hope a few-score persons will not promptly write me asking for the drug, because, as far as I know, it is not yet on the market. For a while the medicine will probably be given only to diabetics who are under observation in a hospital.

Marilyn Watson, 14-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard E. Watson, Central Point, was presented with a heifer consigned by the Oregon Heifer association. Marilyn has been a member of the Central Point 4-H club for the past year. Jossy said the sale was one of the most successful ever held here. A large crowd attended and the sale was a fast one, he added. The Herefords were shown in the ring the day before the sale. Auctioneer was Ellis White, Ontario.

Toll Figures Adopted For Interstate Bridge

Olympia, Wash.—A toll schedule fixing 20-cent fares for passenger cars was adopted by the Washington Toll Bridge Authority Friday for a new interstate bridge across the Columbia river between Vancouver and Portland. D. B. Hedges, TBA secretary, said the schedule was estimated to be sufficient to retire a proposed \$14,500,000 bond issue by 1966 on an assumed interest rate of three per cent. The schedule also would apply to the existing interstate span, which will be reconstructed as part of the project.
