

Adenauer Warns West To Keep Guard Against Soviets

Eden Planning To Reopen 'Summit' Talks With Premier Bulganin and Khrushchev

London — (U.P.) — Prime Minister Anthony Eden plans to reopen the "summit" talks next month with Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin and Communist Party Chief Nikita Khrushchev, informed sources said today.

Eden goes before the House of Commons today to give full details of the Russians' 12-day visit. The sources said at least four of those 12 days will be set aside for major discussions. Government sources said Eden hoped to take up where the West left off at last summer's "summit" conference with discussions on East-West contacts, Germany and disarmament — the three main subjects on which East and West are deadlocked.

Eden was reported to believe that Russian policy has not changed since the stormy foreign ministers meeting in Geneva ended last November in complete deadlock on those topics. But the sources said Eden saw no discrepancy in Khrushchev's recent attack on Josef Stalin and his refusal of concrete moves to relax international tension.

But it was believed Eden would try to take advantage of any good will that may come out of the Soviet leaders' visit here on April 18.

In the past few days the Russians have stepped up their softening-up campaign which has included pro-British broadcasts by Moscow Radio, renewed invitations to British leaders to visit Russia and the current glad-handing visit of former Premier Georgi Malenkov.

Chancellor Says Tensions Uneased By 'Smile' Policy

Bonn, Germany — (U.P.) — Chancellor Konrad Adenauer warned the West today to keep up its guard because the new Soviet "smiles" policy has not eased the tensions of the cold war.

He said that only if the free nations of the West remain united and stable in their alliances will the Soviets finally permit an East-West settlement.

To help maintain that unity and stability, Adenauer pledged that the Bonn Republic would carry out its promise to have a 12-division, 500,000 man German armed force ready to take its place in the NATO alliance within three years as scheduled.

Nehru Plans To Visit Eisenhower in July

Washington — (U.P.) — Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru of India today announced he will meet with President Eisenhower here next July.

The Prime Minister's announcement was released simultaneously by the White House here and in New Delhi.

President Eisenhower earlier this month invited Nehru to visit the United States in a move aimed at improving deteriorating U.S.-Indian relations.

The White House said Nehru plans to arrive in Washington July 6 or 7 and remain until July 10 or 11. He will come here immediately after the Commonwealth Nations Conference in London.

Milk Production Heads for Record

Washington — (U.P.) — The Agriculture Department reported today milk production is heading for a new record in 1956.

The total milk output this year is expected to be 126 to 127,000,000 pounds, compared to 123,500,000,000 last year.

Dairy economists made the prediction in a summary report in the Agriculture Department's periodical, "The Dairy Situation."

The economists also predicted prices to farmers for milk and butterfat will not change much during the next 12 months, barring widespread drought.

Cash receipts increased slightly from 1954 to 1955 because of larger volume sold. They probably will show a further increase in 1956.

Wisconsin continued its long-time position as the number one milk producing state with 16,600,000,000 pounds in 1955.

Mental Illness Cure Declared 'Backward'

Princeton, N. J. — (U.P.) — Dr. William C. Menninger, of the famous Menninger Foundation in Topeka, Kan., charged last night the nation is "backward" in curing mental illness.

"First, we fear mental illness. We are all a little eccentric and we try to cover this up by blaming someone else," he said.

"Secondly, the cost is great. Two hundred-billion dollars is being spent annually for state institutions. This is not nearly enough.

"The third reason," he said, "is we don't have anywhere near the amount of trained personnel necessary."

Gov. Robert B. Meyner praised Menninger as one of the leaders in explaining mental disease to the people and thus helping to destroy beliefs "inherited from the Dark Ages."

First Interview

The 80-year-old Adenauer gave his views and promises in an interview with United Press. He received this reporter in his office at the Bonn chancellery in the first such interview he has granted since the West German Parliament gave him the final okay last week to press ahead with rearmament.

He stressed that there has been no letup in the cold war despite the switch in Soviet tactics from frowns and threats to smiles and charm.

"I think you will agree with me," he said, "that despite the changed Soviet tactics, the tensions in the world have not eased. The reason is that the causes of tension have not been removed—that is to say, conditions of injustice in different parts of the world, such as the division of Germany."

Other Major Points

Then, in a sweeping survey of cold war issues, the Chancellor made these other major points:

1. Any sign of Western weakness can only encourage the Reds.
2. Continued talks between the United States and Russia on world problems are "particularly important," but the time is not yet ripe for another Big Four conference.
3. West Germany will not lag in her rearmament time table.
4. He has several invitations to visit the United States this year, and is always ready to do so.
5. He is confident that France and Western Germany will reach agreement on the troublesome issue of the Saar.
