The nursery plantings of last year were highly successful, the young trees, less than a year old, are as large as the average three year olds, and look as though many of them will bloom this spring.

The following items are taken from the Table Rock news of March 1, 1912, written by G. P. Hall, correspondent at that time.  
"Everybody is busy plowing and seeding. Many Table Rock people attended the literary at Agate last Saturday evening. Calvin Noon returned a few days ago from a weeks vacation at Medford. He came back the proud possessor of new set of false teeth. D. D. Sage, of Forest Grove is repairing his house at Table Rock, and may bring his family back here to live. Your Correspondent gave a lecture Sun. eve. at Table Rock. Subject: "What is Life". Some said we tried to take too big a chip for our hatchet. There have been some fine trout and steelheads caught in the river lately. Many men and boys at Tolo have gone to the hills with their shovels and gold pans, and are said to be making good wages. Some of the orchard people have been hauling out spray and getting ready to spray their trees. We have heard that E. W. Carlton contemplates planting 50 acres to potatoes.  
"The foundation is being prepared for the new bungalow on the Modoc Ranch. Have heard that it is to cost \$20,000.  
"A more up to date fence in front of our school would be a credit to the community."  
At that time, the plowing correspondent wrote about what was done with horses, most of the farms having several teams, and the larger ones, such as the Modoc Orchard, around 40 horses and mules.  
The foundation of the \$20,000 "bungalow" is still on the elevated site on the side of Table Rock, but the bungalow was never completed.  
The reminder about the fence around the school lot was heeded and given immediate attention, as a clause in the deed to the lot made it mandatory that a lawful fence be kept up.  
E. W. Carlton planted a large acreage between his bee rows to potatoes. We don't know how many acres, but we know he had too many spuds, as did every one else that year, and there was no support price either.

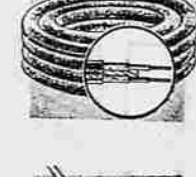
