**McKay Asks BLM, O&C Funds Restored**  
 Washington — (U.P.) — Interior Secretary Douglas McKay today asked the Senate Appropriations Committee to restore funds cut by the House for Bureau of Land Management operations and for construction of roads on O&C lands in Oregon.  
 In a letter to the committee, which now is considering a supplemental appropriations bill, McKay requested that two million dollars be restored for road construction and \$881,700 for Bureau of Land Management operations.  
 McKay said in his letter to the committee that approval of funds to accelerate timber sales on federal lands, "will result in sales of 65 million board feet of badly needed timber." He also noted the economic importance of the lumber industry to certain sections of the country and declared that "sound conservation dictates that we do not overcut, but neither do we cut below the optimum sustained yield allowance."
