

Brochure of County Services Is Ready For Publication

A brochure indexing community services available thru public and private agencies in Jackson county is ready for publication, and printing will be done by the United Medford Crusade.

The brochure has been a major project of the group, UMC's inter-agency committee. Elliott Becken is chairman of the brochure committee.

Reports were presenting at a Tuesday meeting concerning children's services and discussion included employment for teen-agers, foster home certification, child guidance and home-making services.

One particular need that was emphasized was for more foster

homes for teen-agers and particularly for those with serious behavior problems.

It was stated that the Medford high school employment service, which has been established to assist students in finding part-time jobs so that they can remain in school, aids 40 to 50 students each year. Working hours are on Saturdays and after school.

Miss Barbara Settem, child welfare consultant with the state welfare department, told of homemaker services provided by public assistance in another county.

Homemaker Service
Jackson county at the present time does not have a community-sponsored homemaker service program. A need was pointed out for such a program to aid families during and after such emergencies as death or hospitalization of mothers.

Miss Celia Walker, Jackson county welfare worker, cited a case in the county in which a motherless family was provided with homemaker aid by a local church.
