

Oregon Democratic Governor Candidate Raps Tax Program

Corvallis—(U.P.)—Robert D. Holmes, Gearheart legislator campaigning for the Democratic nomination for governor, recently told a Corvallis audience that Republican legislators had probably cost Oregon taxpayers some \$100,000,000 in lost taxes.

The Clatsop county radio station executive said he was preparing a major speech on Oregon's tax problem. He said Republican officials had forgiven 75 per cent of state income taxes during wary years to create the "staggering deficit" faced by the 1955 Legislature.

Holmes charged that writing off the taxes was "poor politics" used by Republicans to remain in office.

He also pointed the finger at the Republicans for the increase in state income taxes this year and declared it was their program that reduced the dependency credits of taxpayers from \$800 to \$600. Some Democrats in the Legislature went along, he said, because it was either that or no tax program at all.

He charged that the present income tax rates would give Oregon a surplus of from \$15,000,000 to \$20,000,000.

"It's all part of a carefully engineered program to force a sales tax," he said.

Water Meter Readers Use Three-Wheel Cars

Chicago—(U.P.)—The three-wheel motor vehicle is being pressed into service for Atlanta, Ga., water meter readers.

More than 100,000 meters have to be read every month, and some 3,000 are added each year, the American Public Works Association reported.

Many of the meters in the city's outlying sections are long distances apart, and it's hoped the three-wheel, gas-powered vehicles will help speed things up.

All the Best Oranges Aren't Shipped Back East

One often hears consumers mutter "the best oranges are all shipped back east—We never get them out here". As a matter of fact, there are plenty of the very best oranges right here. They're priced a little higher and we're likely to pass them by. We usually take a look around and buy the bargain; brag about our good buys. Which is fine. Oranges are excellent buys throughout most of the year and the bargains are packed with good flavor and nutrition. But like everything else, you get what you pay for, in oranges.

There are plenty of those quite superior oranges with even more nutrition and flavor, better appearance and less shrinkage. And many think them the best buy even though they're pennies higher. Plain or fancy, your market has them.

Ambrosia Fluff
Plentiful oranges or premium quality make very good eating in this fancy dessert which puts zing into Spring desserts.

Add one tablespoon confectioner's sugar to one cup heavy cream and whip until stiff; add four tablespoons orange marmalade. Fold in 1 1/2 cups bite-size orange slices and one-fourth cup coconut (or perhaps you'd like to try two tablespoons chopped nuts instead). Add two tablespoons lemon juice and blend thoroughly. Pile lightly into sherbet glasses and set in refrigerator to chill. Four servings. Better make several batches.

Orange-Raisin Coleslaw
Combine four cups shredded green cabbage, two cups orange chunks and one-half cup seedless raisins.

Stir one tablespoon lemon juice into one-half cup mayonnaise; season with salt and pepper. Add mayonnaise mixture to cabbage, oranges and raisins; toss well. If it's a party and you want it fancy or if you want to encourage daughter to make it prettier, serve in orange cups made by cutting large oranges in half and removing meat from shells when fixing the orange chunks. Six servings. Plenty of vitamins.

Oven-Easy Chicken
Plenty of frying chickens at reasonable cost. This is the easiest method of all for preparing fried chicken. Baking time one hour.

1 cut-up chicken for frying
1 cup flour
Salt and Pepper
2 teaspoons paprika
1/2 cup butter

Mix flour, salt, pepper and paprika in a paper bag. Place butter in shallow baking pan and heat in a hot oven, 400 degrees. Shake three or four pieces of chicken in the bag at a time to coat each piece thoroughly. Remove baking pan from oven and arrange chicken in pan skin-side down in a single layer. Return to oven and bake 30 minutes. Turn chicken skin-side up and bake 30 minutes more or until tender.

Nice thing about this is that if the chicken cannot be served at once, you can reduce the oven heat and spoon butter over chicken to keep it moist.

Baked Stuffed Fish
Center of attraction at a big buffet supper often is a luscious whole baked stuffed fish. Why then, isn't baked stuffed fish tailored to fit the family and served more often? Fish steaks and fillets are ideal for stuffing. Plenty of lemon wedges on the side!

2 fish steaks about 1 pound each
Salt and pepper
Bread Stuffing
1/2 cup butter or other fat, melted
3 slices bacon, optional

Sprinkle both sides of fish with salt and pepper. Place on steak in well-greased baking pan. Place stuffing on fish and cover with remaining steak. Fasten with toothpicks or skewers. Brush with melted fat and lay bacon slices on top. Bake in moderate, 350 degree oven, 30 to 40 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork. Remove carefully to a hot platter, remove fasteners and garnish. Six servings.

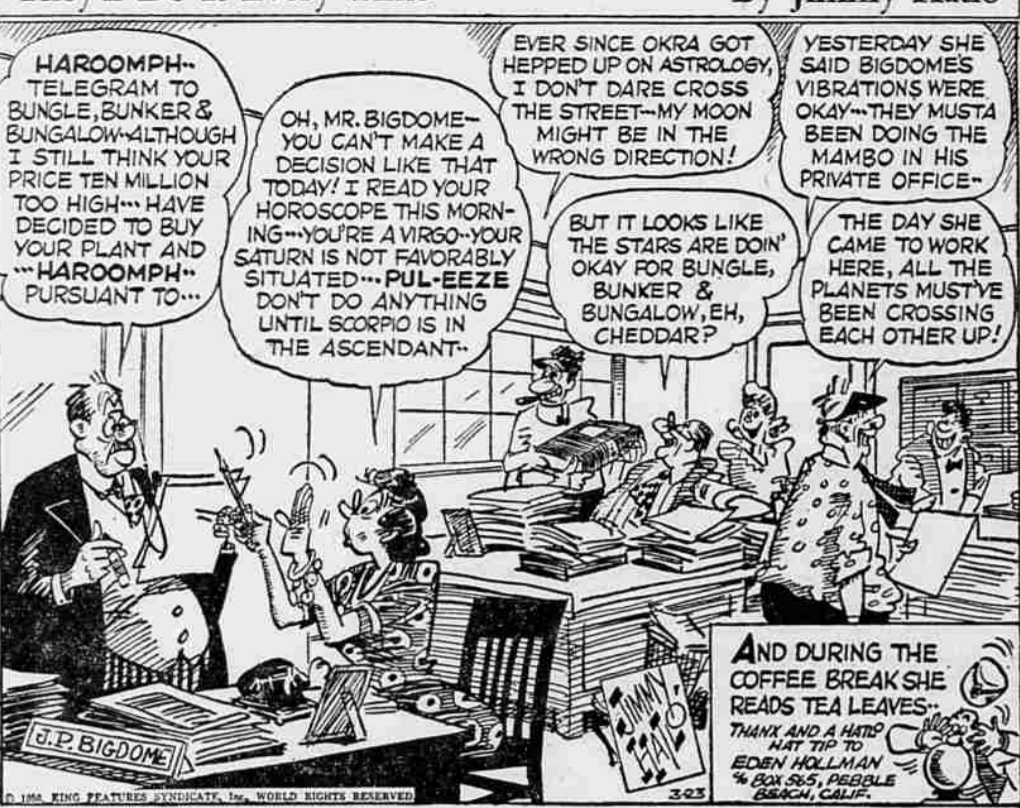

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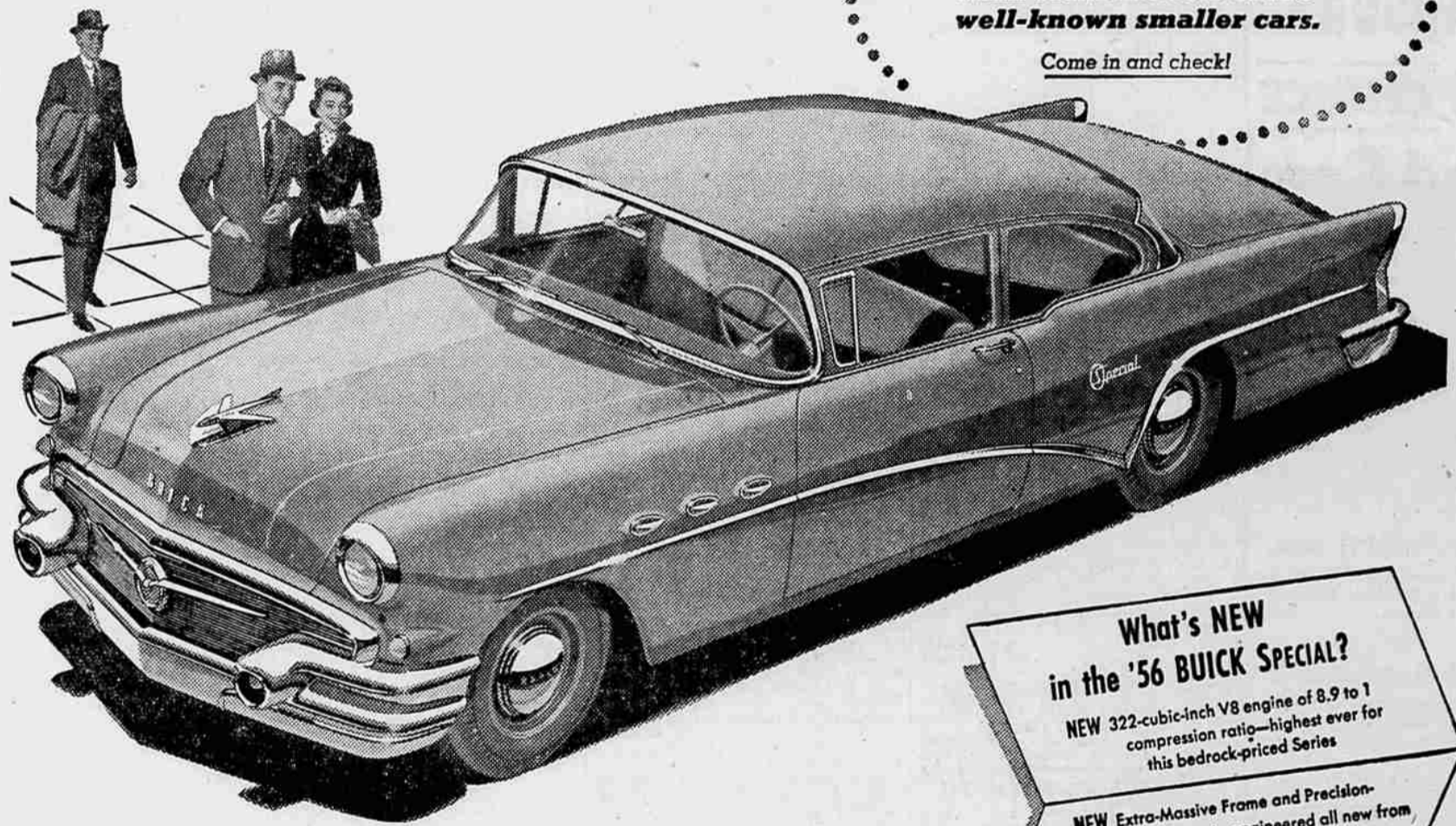
