

### Potato Soup Meal Tonight To Aid German School

Today at 7 p.m., First Church of God members will serve a meal consisting of potato soup and crackers to aid in constructing an interdenominational school in Fritziar, Germany. The meal will be served at the church, Haven and Holly sts.

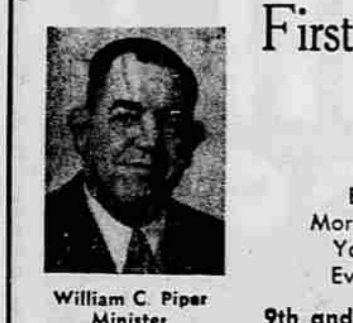
