Portland—UP—Supporters of Adlai Stevenson said Friday they would conduct a campaign for write-in votes for their favorite in Oregon's May 18 primary.

Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) gave the green light to his supporters for such a campaign while changing planes at the airport here early yesterday en route to California.

Alfred Corbett, co-chairman of the Oregon Stevenson for President committee, said "I think everyone has assumed that a write-in campaign is inevitable."

Neither Kefauver nor Stevenson, Democratic presidential aspirants, entered the Oregon primary but write-in votes would serve to instruct Oregon's 16-man delegation to the national convention.

Doubtless his physicians have told him that most of the men who recover after having suffered the plugging-up of a small branch of a coronary artery are left with so small a scar that it does not weaken the force of the beat of the heart; it does not interfere with the efficiency or health of the heart, and thence it does not interfere at all with the efficiency of the man. He will have neither shortness of breath nor pain on exertion. In other words, he will be physically fit.

One thing I feel sure of and this is that the American people should not fear that in the next five years the President's health will not be equal to his tasks. Most assuredly, he can and will outwork and outlive many of us who are younger than he and have never had a day's illness.

I am reminded of the wife, aged 45, who was always fussing and fretting at her executive husband of 62, trying to get him to ease up. She was so afraid his work at the office would cause him to get a bad heart attack. Perhaps because she fretted so much she died many years before he did!

We Must Not Worship Electrocardiograms

Today, many thoughtful physicians are concerned over the

Obviously, a man's brain and its workings are not handicapped in any way by the presence of a little scar in his heart. The brain is no more handicapped than if the little scar was on the man's abdominal wall, or on his hand or his foot. The man's efficiency is not lowered any more than it would be lowered if he had lost a finger or a toe.

The only reason that some physicians fret over a man like President Eisenhower is that they fear that if he returns to a full and active life he will get another heart attack. They fear that now he is more than usually susceptible to such attacks. Actually, so far as I can tell from available statistics, a man who has had a heart attack has no good reason to go in fear of getting another. He has a big chance of going ten years in good health. And, so far as I know, there are no good statistics to show that he will live longer if he takes it easy than he will if he keeps hard at work.

Manv. Working Hard.

A number of my doctor friends for years have been working hard after an old heart attack. I think they are much better off for having remained at work. I know that if I ever get a coronary attack and ride it out I am going to go back to work hard.

I do think, however, that he President is wise in planning a dignified, quiet campaign handled from the White House. I'd hate to see him going through the terrible strain of months of

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tendency of most intelligent persons, and many doctors, to depend for their opinion in regard to the future of a man with coronary heart disease on the appearance of his electrocardiograms. This is often very wrong.

I was pleased to see that in an interview which Dr. Paul Dudley White gave to SCOPE (Feb. 29) he emphasized his view that one must not depend too much on the appearance of the electrocardiographic record. As he said, "It does not by any means necessarily correlate with the severity of the illness. By and large, one can pick the milder cases fairly well with the help of the cardiographic pattern, but I have frequently seen patients with few, or no, cardiographic abnormalities who die, while others who appear, by the cardiogram, to have large infarcts (injuries), due to plugging of an artery, often survive. In my opinion there has been a tendency in recent years to over-emphasize and over-read electrocardiograms: that is, to read

too much into them."

Dr. White went on to tell about the scores of people who keep coming up to him in hotels and railroad stations to say, "Hello, Dr. White, I am sure you won't remember me, but I saw you 20 years ago for this or that heart condition." Then, perhaps, the man goes on to say that he has gotten along beautifully and very much better than anyone had thought he would. Then Dr. White takes out a little notebook in which he records the man's name and how he has fared through the years. When the doctor gets home, he files the information away with the man's record: As he says, he now has an enormous file full of such case-reports which he hopes to
