Governor Censured By Typographers

Salem — (U.P.) — Gov. Elmo Smith today answered censure action by the Oregon Typographical conference by explaining he inadvertently crossed a picket line while visiting offices of the Bend Bulletin Saturday.

"I certainly was not aware of crossing a picket line when I stopped by the office of the Bend Bulletin Saturday," the governor said.

"The picket was not in front of the Bulletin entrance at the time, and I did not realize until later that the newspaper was being picketed," Gov. Smith asserted.

Picket Unobserved. "The driver of my car said that the picket could not be immediately observed when I got out of the car. He said the picket was standing and talking to another person beyond the premises of the Bulletin and that the picket's sign was obscured until
