Need Family Members Need For Responsibility

(Q) "My husband was only child. All the years he lived at home, his mother used to pick up after him and find things he had misplaced. The result is he has never taken any responsibility for his possessions. Every morning, while I am getting breakfast, he will call me to find this or that thing he needs to finish dressing. When he comes home from the office, he just drops his coat, hat, papers, and anything he has been carrying and if I don't pick them up and put them away, they will stay there until he is ready to use them again. We have two children, 8 and 8 years old. They don't see why they should put away their things when their father doesn't. I am having so much trouble with them that I am constantly after them to put their things away but end up doing it myself. Don't you think people should take some responsibility for their things?" (A) I certainly do think people should be responsible for their possessions or pay the penalty of losing them. You have been too indulgent with your whole family and this has made too much work for you.

Explain this to your husband and emphasize how he is setting a bad example for the children. Surely he will see he is not being fair to you or the children by letting you carry the burden he and they should be carrying.

## Wife Talks Mate Out of Suicide

Norwalk, Calif.—(U.P.)—For three hours a 64-year-old mental hospital patient sat atop a 125-foot water tower yesterday and threatened a suicide leap.

Then a silver-haired woman spoke slowly over a loudspeaker system:  
"Fred, I love you, come down," said Mrs. Ethel Ranney, 60. "Please come down. Everything will be all right. I love you so very much."

Her husband, Fred Ranney, 64, a patient at the Metropolitan State hospital, remained atop the tower on the hospital's grounds for several minutes after his wife's plea. Then he yelled, "All right, honey, I'll do as you say."

Hospital authorities said only Mrs. Ranney's appeal prevented her husband from leaping. He had refused to listen to the appeals of doctors and sheriff's deputies.
