## Milk Strike Poses Detroit Shortage

Detroit — (U.P.) — A growing milk strike by rebellious dairy farmers threatened serious shortages in the city today and a complete shutdown by Monday. Officials of the Fair Share Bargaining Assn. FSBA claimed the strike would cut off 90 per cent of Detroit's milk supply today and would be 100 per cent effective by the week end. "Only hospitals, babies and sick people will get milk this week end regardless of progress in our efforts to obtain a fair price for milk," the FSBA said. Police reported the first major instance of strike violence today when a loaded milk tanker was commandeered by angry farmers and its contents spilled onto the highway. Shouting strikers blocked three lanes of a four-lane road near Brighton, Mich., shortly after midnight and dumped 3,500 gallons of milk valued at \$1,350.

## Senate Race McKay's Idea, Ellsworth Says

Portland — (U.P.) — Rep. Harris Ellsworth (R-Ore.) arrived home for the Easter recess last night and said Interior Secretary Douglas McKay had been thinking for some time about entering the U. S. Senate race. Ellsworth said "You hear a lot about McKay being pressured. But I know he had been thinking about it for a long time and when it got near the deadline he just couldn't resist filing." Ellsworth said that if it was "pressure" that put McKay in the Senate race then a large share of it was internal. The Roseburg lawmaker planned to attend dedication of a new Douglas county courthouse wing in his home town today, spend Easter with his mother in Eugene and then visit Medford, Ashland and Coos Bay areas.

## Inspection Program Into 12th Section

Salem—Slaughterhouses and meat packing plants in Morrow, Malheur, Baker and Gilliam counties will be under pilot meat inspection program operations from March 26 until April 13. The state department of agriculture, which is conducting the survey at request of the legislature, said 12 plants will come under antemortem and post-mortem inspections in the counties. Other plants in the areas are already under voluntary state inspection or inoperative at present. The pilot program, which for the short period follows a pattern of compulsory meat inspection, will enter the 12th area for inspections. Two four-man inspection teams, each headed by a veterinarian inspector, will be in the plants during the three weeks. Information and findings gathered from the survey will be compiled in detail for presentation to the 1957 legislature to determine whether compulsory statewide meat inspection is desirable and necessary and how much it will cost.

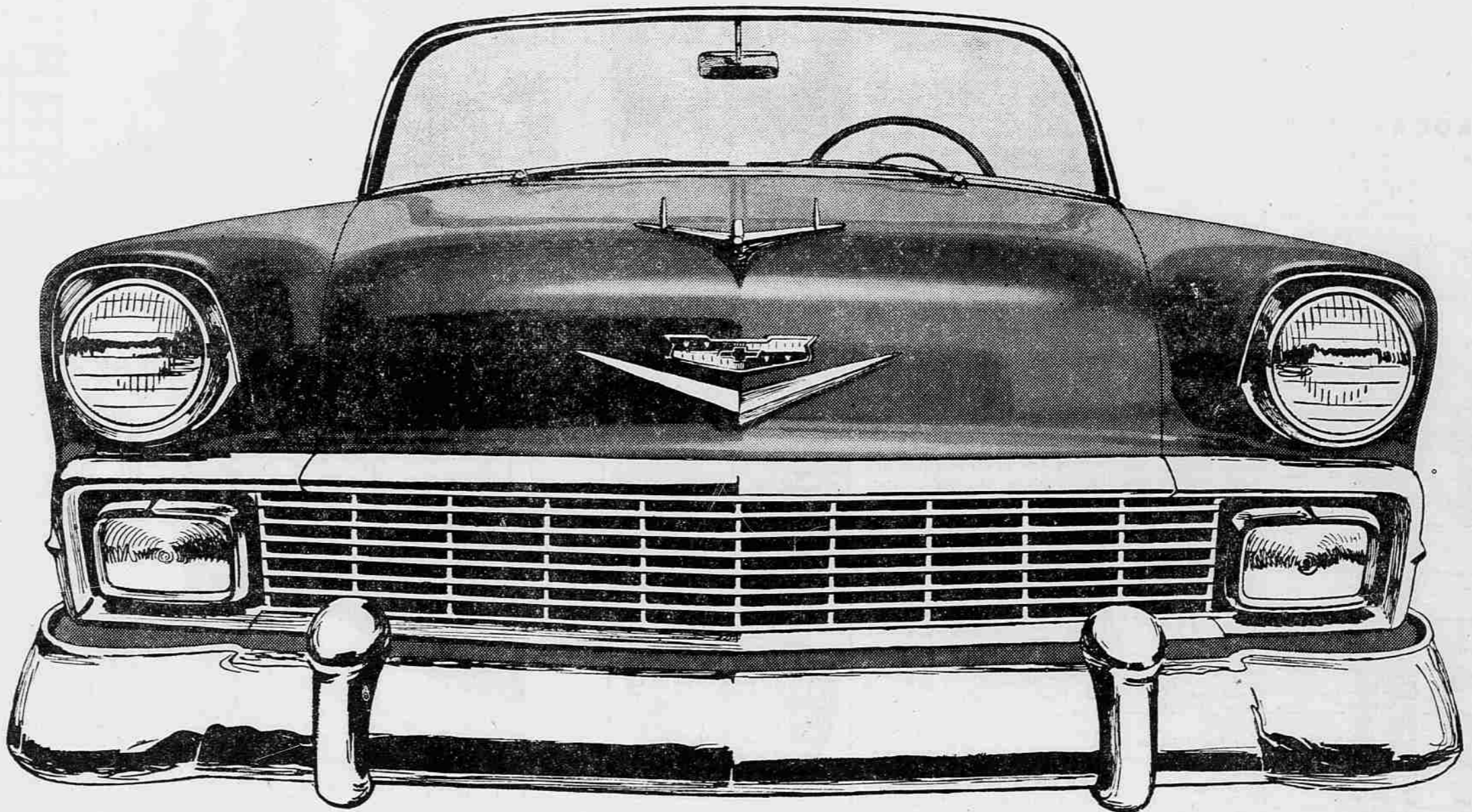
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
