Ronnie Knox Signs Contract With MGM

Hollywood—(U.P.)—UCLA passing star Ronnie Knox has signed a seven-year movie contract with MGM but will be able to complete his college football career next season, his stepfather, Harvey Knox, said today. The elder Knox called the contract "a \$250,000 deal." The starting salary is \$200 weekly, he said.

"Ronnie definitely will play football at UCLA this fall and will finish his college education in theater arts," Knox said. "He will not play pro football. I can do," Ronine said.

Knox, considered one of the top passers in the West, was tested by MGM several weeks ago. The studio had until tonight to pick up an option on his services.

"I've wanted to be an actor for a long time and now I'm going to have a chance to see what I can do," Ronine said.

Ronnie's sister, Patricia, is under contract to Howard Hughes and has appeared in two films.

As long as the young Knox does not appear in any picture which capitalizes on his football ability, his amateur standing will not be affected by the movie contract, his stepfather said.
