Evidence of Violations Reported as Boxing Hearings Near Finish

Los Angeles—(U.P.)—A 10-day sensation-packed probe into California boxing produced "conclusive evidence of some violations," state investigators said today as they ended the hearings here and prepared to resume sessions in San Francisco. Los Angeles Olympic Auditorium matchmaker Babe McCoy, linked directly in testimony with a dozen alleged fight "fixes" and purse-splitting, was the star witness at the hearing which wound up here yesterday. McCoy, faced the strong indication the committee would recommend his license be revoked. He also was notified by special counsel James Cox he would be questioned at a future date concerning alleged income from the East and other parts of the country.

Cox brought out testimony from McCoy that former gambler Mickey Cohen owes him \$5,000. But McCoy denied he ever had done any business with Cohen other than when McCoy, then a manager, managed Mickey as a fighter. A daring daylight holdup of the Olympic Auditorium, netting robbers \$27,000, stole the spotlight on the last day of the boxing investigation which had centered on the stadium's affairs. The bandits, still at large, slugged the stadium's treasurer as he opened the safe.

Successor To Continue Allen's Style

Lawrence, Kan.—(U.P.)—Dr. Forrest C. (Phog) Allen has coached his last basketball game at Kansas, but a lineup of successors indicated Saturday that his style of ball would continue. Allen, 70, was forced into retirement Friday because of his age. His successor, Dick Harp, the Kansas freshman coach, said the style would continue as always and "I shall always look to Dr. Allen for guidance and counsel." Harp, 38, was a standout on Allen's 1940 NCAA runnerup team, and has been assisting the veteran mentor here since 1949. He was given a one-year contract at \$7500 and officially will take over the reins June 30. Jerry Waugh, 29, who also played under Allen for three seasons ending in 1951, was named an assistant coach at \$5500. He had been coaching at Lawrence High school. "There is no greater basketball heritage in the United States than at our university," Harp said. "It will be my constant effort to maintain this tradition which has been fostered so long and well by Dr. Allen."

Phoenix Mittmen Lose to Prospect

Phoenix high school, in its first practice game of the season, lost 4 to 13 to Prospect baseballers Thursday. A short handed pitching staff and lack of practice hampered the Phoenix nine. Jack Thompson on the mound held the score to 3-4 at the end of the fifth inning but after that it was all Prospect. The battery for Prospect was Vannice pitching to Pope. Phoenix has four lettermen out for baseball this season. Coach Jack Woodward hopes to deepen the pitching staff and place emphasis on batting practice before they meet Crater at Phoenix April 6, and again at Central Point April 7.

Cardinals Get Former Tackle for Wisconsin

Chicago—(U.P.)—Bob Konovsky, 245-pound former Wisconsin tackle was signed Saturday by the Chicago Cardinals of the National Football League. Konovsky was the Cardinal's seventh choice in the college draft.

Tillamook Hoop Coach Resigns

Tillamook—(U.P.)—Barney Swanson has resigned as head basketball coach at Tillamook High school. Principal Jack Hornback said Swanson had requested reassignment in the Tillamook school system. The coach, who headed the Chessmaker basketball squad for three years, has been a teacher in Tillamook for nine years.

Bassett Signs 1956 Contract With Browns

Cleveland, Ohio—(U.P.)—The Cleveland Browns announced Saturday that fullback Maurice Bassett has signed his 1956 contract. Bassett, the Browns' regular fullback two years ago, said he already is conditioning himself for the battle to regain the first-string post from Ed Modzelewski. He said he was working as a mail carrier in Cleveland in order to keep his weight down. Bassett gained 174 yards in 38 attempts in 1955.

Commission to Free Salmon in Klaskanine

Portland—(U.P.)—The Oregon Fish commission reported Saturday it is releasing 600,000 young silver salmon in the Klaskanine river. The commission also is planting some 100,000 brood silvers in the South Coos river. Planted last week in Foley creek were 77,000 brood silvers. The Metolius river was planted with 26,000 spring Chinook salmon.
