

Two Public Hearings Scheduled; Other Ordinances Are Adopted

The Medford city council last night adopted ordinances calling for two public hearings, adopting plans and specifications for one sanitary sewer and two street paving projects.

A hearing will be held next morning on construction of a sanitary sewer project for the area south of Capital ave. and West of Valley View dr. to Sunrise ave. which is not now served by sewers. An ordinance was passed adopting plans and specifications for construction.

Hearing Scheduled
A public hearing on change of zone on Clark st. will be held May 1. The request, recommended by the planning commission, is to change from two family (class 1B) to multiple family (class II) the property bounded by Clark st. on the north, Broad st. on the east, Jackson st. on the south and Summit ave. on the west, and for block four in Mary's place addition.

A hearing on changing from single family (class 1A) to multiple family (class II) property in block six of Siskiyou Heights extension was continued until next meeting.

The council continued the hearing pending a letter from the board of directors of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, indicating that if the property were resold after becoming multiple family zone, it would be sold only for use as single family residences.

Objections to Rezoning
Objections to rezoning were based on the amount of property asked to be rezoned. Robert E. Hein, 2121 Oakwood dr., said he was not opposed to the church, but thought that some of the property asked to be rezoned should remain single family residence.

John H. Pletsch, representing the church, said the extra area asked to be rezoned was off-

street parking facilities, which are not allowable under single family, and for future expansion of the church.

He assured the council that directors had written into the minutes: that the property, should it be sold, would be sold only for single family residences.

An ordinance was adopted changing from commercial (class III) to light industrial (class V) a portion of block one in Cottage addition. No one appeared at a public hearing opposing the change.

Plans and Specifications
The council adopted plans and specifications for sanitary sewer construction projects on South Ivy st. from Holmes ave. to Garfield st. and on Whitman ave. from Holmes ave. to Garfield st. Plans and specifications were

Air Force To Build Large Solar Furnace

Washington—(U.P.)—The Air Force said today it will build a large solar furnace capable of producing radiation temperatures of 7,000 to 8,000 degrees Fahrenheit.

A solar furnace is a system of mirrors capable of concentrating the sun's energy on a single spot. The Air Force will use the high temperatures for research, for testing the heat-withstanding capacities of materials and weapons components and for duplicating where possible the thermal effects of nuclear weapons on various materials.

The Air Force said the furnace would be located at about the 9,000 foot level in the Sacramento mountains near Holloman Air Development Center, Alamogordo, N. M. This is an area known for its clear air and abundant sunlight.

authorized for paving Boardman st. from Ohio st. to McAndrews rd., on Modoc ave. from East Main st. to the old city limits, and for a sanitary sewer construction project in block four, Highcroft addition.

The council deferred action on determining a method of assessment for a sanitary sewer in blocks four and five, Highcroft addition, pending further consideration. City Manager Robert Duff pointed out that action on assessing for block five should be deferred pending further recommendations on acquisition of an easement.

Defer Action
Action on assessing block four was deferred on recommendation of the finance committee to determine the most equitable assessment. Two methods were proposed, one on a square foot basis, the other on a per lot basis.

The council voted to assess property in sections of block one, Capital Hill addition, on a per lot basis for a sanitary sewer. The estimated cost per lot is \$543, according to Duff, and lots are the same size and identical in area.

Permission was granted for a loading zone adjacent to the Medford Furniture store at the driveway on Sixth st. between 7 and 11 a.m. The loading zone will eliminate the need for trucks to angle park in violation of existing ordinances and was recommended by the traffic engineering department.

Restricted Parking
A request for restricted parking in front of the Tabu Dinner house, 305 South Riverside ave., between 7 and 11 a.m. was referred to the traffic engineering department for consideration.

The council acknowledged the Public Utilities commissioner's order regarding the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company's extended service proposal in the Medford area, and referred to the planning commission a request from the Jackson County Disaster Car association for acquisition of city property near the East Side fire station to house the car.

Communist Nations Buying Free Goods

Washington—(U.P.)—The Agriculture Department reports Communist nations are buying more farm products from the free world.

A department specialist said yesterday part of the increased trade is "obviously political—designed to win friends" in countries plagued with farm surpluses.

The department itself said only that farm imports by the Communist bloc were based only "in part" on their actual needs.

It said that in some cases the farm products are being offered for resale by the Communists.

It said, for example, Czechoslovakia is offering Egyptian cotton in Western Europe at discount prices. And the Soviet Union has shipped imported wheat to India.

Milwaukee Elects Socialist Mayor

Milwaukee, Wis.—(U.P.)—Milwaukee voters gave Socialist Mayor Frank P. Zeidler a third four-year term Tuesday.

Zeidler defeated Milton J. McGuire, president of the City Council, in heavy balloting after a bitter campaign.

Returns from 470 of the city's 525 precincts gave Zeidler 103,894 votes and McGuire 83,804. Zeidler, a former chairman of the state's once potent Socialist Party, had support from Labor's Political League and a number of Democratic groups in his bid for reelection. McGuire had Republican ward units behind him.

Milwaukee has had Socialist mayors before Zeidler, notably Daniel Webster Hoan, who has since joined Democratic ranks. At one time the city sent a sizeable Socialist contingent to the state legislature.

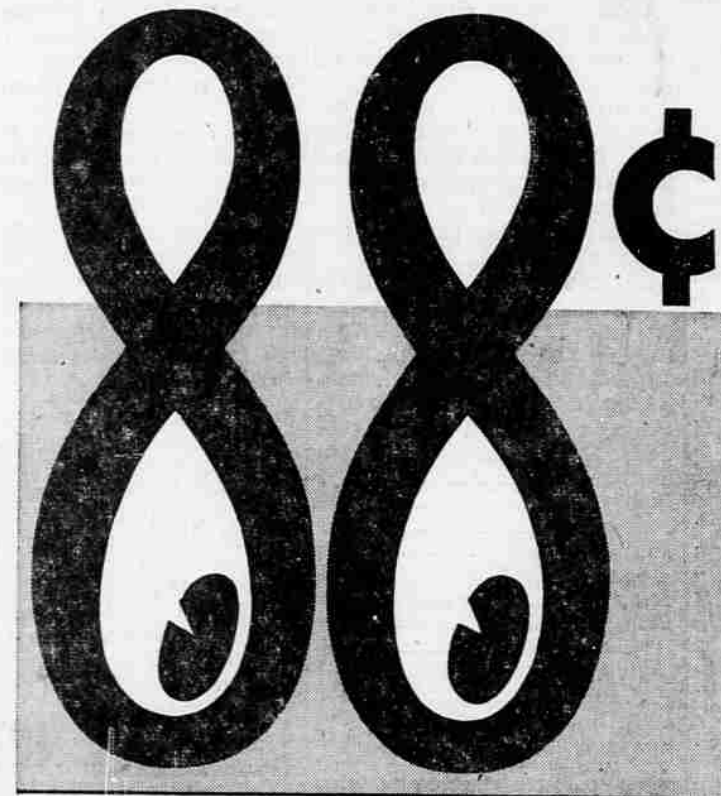
Craft inspected the ravished stockings, some of which were of the "can't run" variety.

He reported little holes in the stockings and dark particles clustered around them.

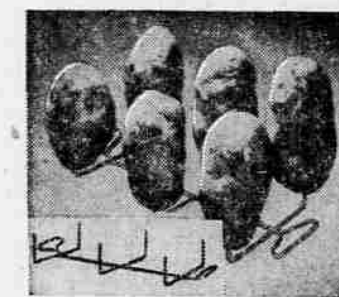
The particles seemed to have
