## NOSE BLEEDS

Some persons ask why they are having repeated nose-bleeds. Commonly, what starts bleeding is picking at the nose or blowing it so hard as to blow it off a little crust that has formed. In the cases of many a nose-bleed, no one can say why it came.

When older persons get many nose-bleeds it is well to have an examination made to see if they have a high blood pressure or some other serious disease. In rare cases in which the person has repeated severe nose-bleeds, a specialist should look to see if the man was born with tiny tumors, perhaps smaller than the head of a pin, made up of thin-walled blood vessels, and scattered through the nose and throat.

Calcium lessens the irritability of the nervous system. Persons who much dislike milk or are highly allergic to it can take at bed-time a tablespoonful of a syrup of the gluconate of calcium.
