## Firms Undertake Powerful Rocket For Satellite

Washington — (U.P.) — Two firms working separately have undertaken to produce for the Earth satellite project the most powerful small rocket ever created.

To do it, engineers say, they will have to achieve a king size "breakthrough" in the art of rocketry.

Their job is to perfect the unprecedented third rocket stage which will give the satellite its final gigantic thrust into space, doubling its second stage speed to a gravity balancing 18,000 miles an hour.

Award of the final stage contracts was announced jointly today by the Navy and the Martin Co., prime contractor of the 72-foot three-rocket "vehicle" which will launch the first artificial moon.

Also announced were two other contracts for electronic and mechanical control mechanisms which will keep the vehicle headed the right way until the satellite has been pushed into its assigned space path around the Earth.

All of the major contracts including those for the first and second rocket stages, have now been awarded, and the satellite project, according to Martin engineers, "is right on schedule."

It was reported that flight tests for the rockets are scheduled to start in November. They will be held, it was said, at the Patrick Air Force Base, Cocoa, Fla., where the satellite will be launched next year.

Picked to develop the third stage power plant, a device unique in the history of rocketry, were the Grand Central Rocket Co., Redlands, Calif., and the Allegany Ballistics Laboratory, operated by the Hercules Powder Co. for the Navy at Cumberland, Md.

They will work independently under a requirement by Martin engineers that they produce "a breakthrough." This rocket, smallest of the three, must pack far more power for its size than any other ever conceived for a practical purpose.

The other contracts disclosed today went to Minneapolis-Honeywell Regulator Co., and Vickers Electric Division, Vickers, Inc., St. Louis.

Minneapolis-Honeywell will build a system of gyroscopes that will keep a constant check on the launching vehicle's comportment as it soars toward the satellite's orbit.

If the vehicle tends to roll, pitch, or wobble the gyros will flash electronic instructions to an auto-pilot which will be built by Vickers. Acting on the gyros' instructions, the auto-pilot will keep the vehicle on its predetermined course.

**Brando May Shave Hair From Chest**  
Tokyo — (U.P.) — Actor Marlon Brando told a news conference yesterday he may shave the hair off his chest to make himself look more like a Japanese.

Brando, who plays the role of a Japanese interpreter in "The August Moon," surprised the conference by making a short speech in Japanese.

He said he had been studying the language with a tape-recorder to prepare himself for his role.

**State Institution Site May Be Changed**  
Salem — (U.P.) — The State Board of Control said yesterday that if a new \$13,000,000 Air Force base is located in the Woodburn area, a new site for the state's \$8,000,000 intermediate institution must be found.

The site purchased for the proposed state institution is approximately 14 miles north of Salem. If the Air Force decides on the Woodburn site, the area would be absorbed in the Air Force property.

## Volcanic Eruptions Reported by Moscow

London — (U.P.) — Moscow radio Wednesday reported two powerful eruptions of Bezymyanni Volcano on the mountainous Kamchatka Peninsula, jutting out into the Bering Sea.

The Communist broadcast heard here said a blast on March 30 sent smoke and ashes 12 miles into the air, with ashes falling over an area 48 miles wide. A second eruption April 1 spewed ashes and gas six miles high over the northeast Siberian region, the radio said.

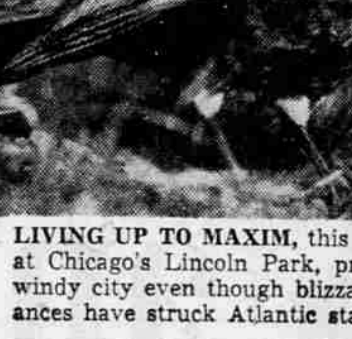
