**U.S. Health Official To Speak Tonight at Child Guidance Meet**

Dr. Henry Schumacher, San Francisco, chief of mental health service in the western region for the United States Public Health Service, will speak tonight at the annual meeting of the Southern Oregon Child Guidance Clinic association.

The dinner meeting will start at 7 p.m. at Hedrick junior high school and the program will start at 7:45 p.m.

Dr. Schumacher and two of his staff members, Miss Frances Williams, a nursing consultant, and Raymond Craig, psychiatric social worker, arrived in Medford Tuesday. They are conducting a study of mental health aspects of the public health program in Jackson county and are expected to make recommendations for improvement of the program.

**Observe Clinic**

The trio started today's schedule by observing the county's child guidance clinic in operation. Dr. John Waterman of the state board of health; Dr. Norman Suintag, psychologist from the University of Oregon; and Miss Mary Vandenberg, psychiatric social worker, conducted the clinic.

At noon the workers met with the administration and personnel committee of the guidance clinic board.

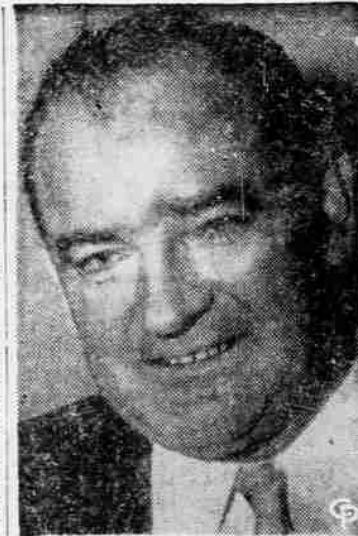
Wednesday morning, Dr. Schumacher and his staff members consulted with various professional people in Jackson county and met with co-chairmen for study groups of the county Parent-Teacher association and mental health chairmen of the county public health association. Purpose of the meeting was to discuss the training program for leaders of the various study groups.

Also during the morning Miss Williams accompanied Miss Dorothy Collard, Jackson county nursing supervisor, to a meeting of the Lone Pine study group.

The family counseling service that has been under consideration here for several years was the discussion subject Wednesday noon when the visitors met with the county mental health committee. Members of the committee on problems of the aging and inter-agency council also attended the session.

At a 3 p.m. meeting, Dr. Schumacher and staff members discussed the school health program here with the joint school health committee. The committee is comprised of school principals, school superintendents, representatives from the health department, president of the medical society and a member
