Bunions: Can Anything be Done?

A woman has been wearing shoes so small that they have forced her big toes over into the middle of her foot. As a result, the joint between the big toe and the foot projects as a sharp angle into her shoe, and hurts her terribly. The thing for her to do is to go to a good orthopedist, or perhaps a general surgeon who can reconstruct the joint so that the big toe will point straight ahead as it did when she was a child. The surgeon will not be able to promise a perfect result because much may depend on how much arthritis she will have in the joint. But she should be better.

This woman's experience should be a lesson to all young women who like to cram their feet into shoes that are too short and too pointed. Every woman ought occasionally to look at a baby to see what a foot should look like. I do not expect many women to wear sensible shoes; they won't wear them; they want to be beautiful and this is the all-important consideration!

Infectious Mononucleosis

Many troubled persons want to know what is infectious mononucleosis. It is an infectious disease, presumably due to a virus. In the old days, it was sometimes called glandular fever because lymph nodes in the neck and elsewhere become enlarged. The disease can be recognized by an expert on blood when he looks at the stained blood smears or when he performs a test for the so-called heterophile antibody.

The order, which goes into effect next Monday, bans slow railroad freight service for unsorted carloads of lumber.

Three Sentenced in Circuit Court Here

Two men were sentenced to the Oregon state penitentiary, one man was given a suspended sentence and a woman was released on her own recognizance in circuit court yesterday.

Sentenced to one year each in the penitentiary on forgery charges were Lawrence Duncan Ferguson, 20, Renton, Wash., and William Hugh Mitchell, 19, Jerry Yates Sparling, 26, of 726 Oak st., pleaded guilty to an indictment charging entering a motor vehicle with intent to steal and was given a three-year suspended sentence. He was represented by his attorney, O. H. Bengtson.

Mr. William Governor, 33, of 903 West 11th st., pleaded guilty to a charge of obtaining money under false pretences and was released on her own recognizance.

Council Warns of Reservoir Hazards

Jacksonville—Unsifted bottom dirt in Jacksonville reservoir is particularly hazardous to anyone using the reservoir for swimming purposes, Jacksonville city council has announced.

The council pointed out the condition mainly for parents of young people and children who allow them to make use of the reservoir.

During the winter silt from hills above, burned over in the 1955 fall fires, has sifted into the water and combined with shale and granite renders the bed shifty and "jelly-like."

Though still early in the season reports of numerous swimmers at the reservoir have been made.

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Council Votes to Favor Armory Bid

The city council Tuesday night voted to approve whatever recommendation the Oregon state military department makes for awarding a contract for construction of a new armory here.

Bids were opened recently with Wiley company and L. C. McLaughlin, Ashland, submitting the apparent successful bid.

Councilman Harold Frye, a member of the armory committee, said the architects, county court and the committee believe the bid submitted by Wiley and McLaughlin would be acceptable.

The bid was on a basic figure of \$338,988 for the job in which the federal government will participate, and \$61,541 for work the state will finance.

The council directed City Manager Robert Duff to notify Lt. Col. Paul L. Kliever, director of armories for the state military department, of last night's action.
