What to Do for a Cured Gonorrhea?

This title will doubtless puzzle physicians who see it, but actually, I get many requests for information about what to do about the supposed residual bad effects of a "cured" gonorrhea. I doubt very much if there are such bad effects left in the body. The only ones left in some highly worrisome men are in the brain and consist of fears. Today, when a man is cured of gonorrhea, he is "cured" and can stop worrying.



In the old pre-penicillin days a man who had gonorrhea was often left with a stricture of urethra, or the little tube that carries the urine from the bladder to the outside. Such strictures often made it hard for the man to urinate, and from time to time throughout his life, he might have to have the tube dilated with so-called sounds. In many cases gonorrhea was followed, also, by prostatitis, or by an infection in the seminal vesicles which hold the semen. They lie just above the prostate gland, which surrounds the neck of the bladder and produces most of the fluid part of the semen. Men with prostatitis and seminal vesiculitis were often uncomfortable. Often they were the more uncomfortable because they worried much about the situation and feared that it would interfere with their sexual powers.

In her pelvis. In women and also in men gonorrhea used to be one of the greatest causes of infertility. In the cases of men whose seminal tubes had been gummied up by gonorrhea the sperm cells could not get from the testicles up into the seminal vesicles; and in women the ovum could not get from the ovary into the fallopian tube, or if it got into the tube, it could not get through into the womb.

Fortunately, today, with the quick cures commonly achieved with the help of penicillin, both men and women are far less likely, unwittingly, to go on and give their disease to others. The innocent wife is far less likely to be infected. Today, no man has any excuse to marry when he is infected.

Syphilis Different Disease

As far as we physicians know, aside from the conditions that I

have mentioned, gonorrhea leaves no generalized or long-lasting effects such as are commonly left by syphilis. Syphilis is an entirely different disease from gonorrhea. Gonorrhea is due to a little germ, called a gonococcus, while syphilis is due to a very tiny spiral organism, called a spirochete. Syphilis is a disease of the whole body and one which, if not well treated, can last a lifetime. In its later stages it is particularly likely to attack the arteries, the brain and the spinal cord. In the old days one of the common forms of insanity was produced by syphilis. The so-called paresis, or paralysis of the insane. In this disease the patient often gets delusions of grandeur. He thinks he is a great king and very wealthy. A formerly common form of weakness and lack of control of the legs can be produced by syphilis. Sixty per cent of the aneurisms or big blow-outs of weak spots in arteries used to be due to syphilis.

Not Inherited
Fortunately, today, we physicians are seeing many fewer syphilitic patients than we used to see. I now rarely see one, and it is years since I have recognized a person with congenital syphilis. This is not an inherited disease. It is usually disease given by the husband to his wife and then given by the wife to the child in her womb.

Some young people feel now, that the danger from venereal disease has been so reduced that it can be disregarded; but this is not true. Perhaps 85 per cent

of persons well treated soon get well, but there is another 15 per cent in which things do not go smoothly, and it is not easy to get a cure.

Many persons who worry themselves sick fearing they have got syphilis in some way should not go on doing this. They should go right off to an expert—usually a dermatologist

or skin specialist—who will get one or more tests for syphilis made. If they are "negative" and if the expert says, "Stop worrying," the person should take his advice.

CROSSWORD PUZZLE

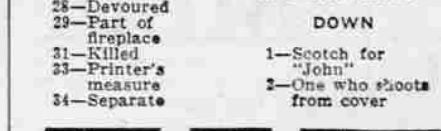
