DEW Line Camps Dot Northern Wasteland

Victoria Island—(U.P.)—The giant Globemaster plane picks its way down through the whiteness and rolls smoothly to a stop on a frozen runway. Wind-blown snow hides the horizon and makes it hard to tell where

the sky leaves off and ground begins.
Camp Materializes
A mile or so away by snowmobile the DEW Line construction camp materializes, quonsets with smoke puffing from overhead interiors, shacks fashioned from packing crates, a plastic work tent slung over steel-pipe frame. On a nearby rise stand prefabricated permanent structures where civilians manning the far northern radar warning line will live and work.

Hubbard Brothers to Observe 72nd Year

Hubbard Brothers Hardware company, 335 East Main st., will begin a spring sale Thursday to commemorate its 72nd anniversary.

The firm was started as a farm implement business in the spring of 1884 in Jacksonville by Fort Hubbard. Later, the store was taken over by his son, Asahel Hubbard, father of the present owners, Chester and Roland Hubbard.

This camp is larger than most but otherwise typical of dozens that stretch for 3000 miles across the continent's Arctic rim where the Distant Early Warning Line is being strung to give four to six hours notice of Russian jet bomber attack.

You don't beat the Arctic; you learn to live with it as the Canadian Mounted Police, trappers and missionaries have done.

Conference on Auto Theft Slated by FBI

Eugene—A federal bureau of investigation enforcement conference on auto theft will be held in Eugene April 12, according to J. F. Santoianna Jr., special agent in charge of the Portland office.

More than 100 conferences of this type have been scheduled throughout the United States by the FBI. One will be held in Portland April 19 and in Pendleton April 26.

The conferences are designed to bring about additional coordination among law enforcement agencies and improved efficiency in dealing with auto theft, Santoianna said.

An estimated 215,940 autos were stolen in the U.S. in 1954. Although 94 per cent subsequently were located, at the year end 12,956 cars valued at more than \$12,000,000 still were unrecovered.
