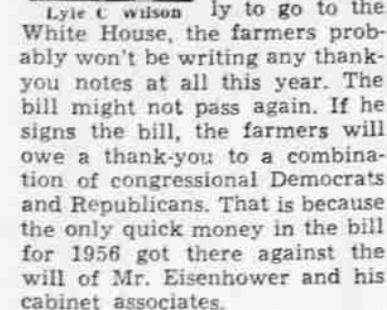


To Whom Will Farmers Owe Notes Of Thanks for Farm Subsidy Bill?

Washington — (U.P.) — What the farm subsidy dispute has been about is whether farmers shall owe thank-you notes for some quick money to Republicans or Democrats.



If President Eisenhower vetoes the farm bill now shortly to go to the White House, the farmers probably won't be writing any thank-you notes at all this year. The bill might not pass again. If he signs the bill, the farmers will owe a thank-you to a combination of congressional Democrats and Republicans. That is because the only quick money in the bill for 1956 got there against the will of Mr. Eisenhower and his cabinet associates.

Up to now, the Democrats have gotten the best of the farm bill skirmishing for presidential election year votes. A great many Republicans in and out of Congress believe a veto would destroy any chance the party may have to regain control of the House this year.

Cole cancelled plans to fly to Los Angeles to visit his family on the advice of his physician. Cole flew to Chicago from Birmingham late yesterday and Dr. James M. Scott treated him for back and arm injuries suffered in the melee. He advised him to stick close to his hotel room and take it easy before returning to the South tomorrow.

Three Men Ascending Mountain in Effort To Rescue Pack Horse Stranded on Ledge

Buena Vista, Colo. — (U.P.) — Three men left their Jeep and continued on snowshoes today in their climb to rescue Elijah, the problematic pack horse stranded on a mountain ledge.

The three, a sportsman and two Denver television men, set off on snowshoes after driving part way up the North Cottonwood Trail in a Jeep. They hoped to reach Elijah this afternoon and planned to remain on the lofty perch overnight if it appeared they couldn't make it down the mountain before dark.

Salem — The state department of agriculture has announced regulations governing inspection of livestock brought into Oregon which became effective Tuesday, according to J. F. Short, director of agriculture, and M. E. Knickerbocker, animal division chief.

Bank Bandit Escapes With \$66,000 in Cash

Williamsport, Pa. — (U.P.) — A tall, slender young bandit, wearing a trench coat and tinted sun glasses, escaped with \$66,000 in cash today after he held up the Williamsport National bank five minutes after it opened for the day.

Health Certificate

All animals must be accompanied by an official health certificate which becomes void 30 days after issuance. A copy of the official health certificate must be forwarded immediately to the state department of agriculture, Salem.

Regulations governing duties of carriers require that all cars or trucks for livestock and poultry must be in sanitary condition.

All conveyances used in moving livestock infected or disease-exposed must be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected under official supervision before re-use in transporting livestock. The official health certificate for dogs must show the dogs have not been exposed to rabies and were vaccinated against rabies.

Control fleas on dogs and cats.

Commercial powders containing rotenone or pyrethrum will control fleas on dogs and cats.
