

Clergymen Prepare For Rites

Monaco — Bishop Giles Barthe summoned Catholic clergymen Saturday for a rehearsal of plans for the marriage of a prince and an actress in whose lives religion plays a dominating part.

Bishop Barthe will officiate at the religious ceremony Thursday that will make Prince Rainier III and Grace Kelly man and wife in the eyes of the church. The church does not recognize the civil ceremony to be performed Wednesday but it is required by law here.

The Rev. Francis Tucker, Rainier's jovial chaplain, said he would be at the rehearsal today. Hold 'Blackboard' Drills
"I'm going over the bishop's for a blackboard session," he said smilingly. "It's just like football, isn't it, only I hope we won't make any fumbles."

It was disclosed today that Miss Kelly's first act upon entering Rainier's palace last Thursday was to kneel in prayer. She kissed the bishop's ring immediately and then went straight to the chapel and knelt with the prince. The bishop blessed them there.

Both Rainier and Miss Kelly are devout in their Catholic faith. They probably will attend mass together Sunday, the last sabbath before their marriage. Photo Ban On

Miss Kelly and the prince have kept on an indefinite schedule since her arrival. They have made a point of not seeing each other unchaperoned until their marriage.

The shy prince blew up Friday night, though, and angrily ordered all press photographers barred from the civil wedding because of their "intolerable maneuvers" in trying to take pictures of him and his fiancée.

He had appeared affable when some 50 photographers formed a human chain across a road on which he was driving Miss Kelly in the afternoon. But when he returned to the palace, the photographers got the bad news from his press secretary.
