

**Hospital Attendants Halt Column of Ants**  
 London — (U.P.) — Attendants at suburban Wembley hospital saw a column of ants heading for the hospital kitchen Tuesday and went into action. It almost ruined the hospital.  
 They poured methylated spirits on the ants. The vapors caught fire from a gas heater. Firemen stationed next door were out and four other companies had to dash to the blaze.  
 The fire was confined to the kitchen but it was badly damaged. Not an ant survived.

**Marriages of American Soldiers To Koreans Average Four Weekly**

 Seoul—(U.P.)—An average of four American soldiers a week marry Korean women.  
 The servicemen say Korean women make more patient, loyal and affectionate wives than the American girls.  
 The statistics come from the U.S. Embassy in Seoul. The opinions are from GIs interviewed by United Press.  
 Last year, 198 GI-Korean couples were married and received visas. This year's total is expected to be even higher, said Webster Mason, U.S. Vice Consul in Seoul.  
 Thirty-nine American soldiers have taken their Korean brides to the American Embassy this year to receive visas, and another 250 couples have visa applications on file.  
 Sgt. Robert Curtiss, 31, of Hammond, Ind., explained why he married a Korean.  
 "Korean girls," he said, "are more patient and don't get upset as easily as American women."  
 Curtiss met his 26-year-old wife, Nan Suk, in Pusan two years ago when she was working as a waitress in a sergeants-officers mess hall.  
 When the couple moved to Seoul, Nan Suk—called Maygie by her husband—rented a Korean-styled room near the Eighth U.S. Army headquarters. She has no problem.  
 Military regulations do not permit the sergeant, a military policeman, to live at the house, but he can visit his wife and their five-month-old daughter daily.  
 The Curtiss family will leave for the U.S. in a few weeks. He is scheduled to be stationed at Fort Belvoir, Va.  
 Curtiss feels that a Korean wife will be no problem in the Army.  
 "They don't worry about segregation," he said, "and lots of soldiers have wives from foreign countries."  
 Pfc. Eugene Drier, 22, of Portville, Ia., figures the same applies to living in a small mid-west farming community.  
 "My wife will get along fine with the folks back home," he said. "Some of my buddies brought back girls from France and Mexico."  
 Drier's wife, 21-year-old Ae Kyung, was looking for a job in his Army company last year when the two struck up a halt-
