

Eisenhower May Lick Stevenson At Democrats' Own Convention

Washington — (U.P.) — President Eisenhower had to await election day to defeat Adlai E. Stevenson in 1952. He may lick Stevenson this year in the Democratic National convention.

The way some political experts see it is like this: Mr. Eisenhower has borrowed heavily from some parts of the Roosevelt and Truman deals to construct the foundation of his own administration's policy.

In welfare legislation there isn't a great deal of difference between Mr. Eisenhower's approach and the approach of his immediate predecessors. That is

true in the fields of minimum wages, school subsidies, social security, farm subsidies and such, somewhat less with respect to public housing. On farm subsidies, for example, the difference between the administration and the Democrats was less how than how much.

Mr. Eisenhower has been moving the Republican Party at least to the middle of the road on such matters and, perhaps, a bit to the left of center. Stevenson has been moving in the other direction. Stevenson announced his intention to seek nomination last autumn and followed up with a speech in which he said:

"It is a time for catching our breath. Moderation is the spirit of the times."

That was the party line of most of the Democratic leaders of Congress. Many of them from the South and from border states. Not so however in all parts of the North. Gov. Averell Harriman of New York snapped that there was no room in the Democratic Party for "moderation." Michigan's Gov. G. Mennen Williams shortly was saying that the Stevenson theme of moderation simply would not do in 1956.

In the minds of Williams, Harriman and, apparently Sen. Estes Kefauver, the Democrats must wage their 1956 campaign in the fervor of the old-time New Deal religion. And where Mr. Eisenhower has moved into former New Deal territory, they must stake out new territory of their own.

That adds up in terms of practical politics to a 1956 Democratic move toward outbidding the Republicans in such fields as welfare and farm subsidies. Where Stevenson would slow down a bit here and there, some northern and western Democratic leaders would move a little faster or farther. Mr. Eisenhower, for example, proposed a 90-cent minimum wage. The Democratic Congress made it a dollar and the Democratic platform probably will propose a hike above that to \$1.25.

Stevenson is caught in the middle between Mr. Eisenhower's liberalized Republican Party and the Democrats who want to put some pocketbook welfare and instant civil rights bait in the 1956 Democratic platform.

Mr. Eisenhower seems to have maneuvered the moderate Stevenson into that spot. If so, he has boosted the chances of some one far less moderate to be nominated for president by the Democrats this year.

Legislative Counsel Predicts Bill Drafting

Salem — (U.P.) — Legislative Counsel Sam Haley predicted today that more bills would be drafted and ready for introduction when the 1957 Legislature opens than at any previous session.

Haley said he had received 52 requests for bill drafting to date compared with 21 received at about the same time before the legislative session two years ago.

Argentine Ministers Approve Tunnel Project

Buenos Aires — (U.P.) — The Argentine Council of Ministers approved Thursday construction of a \$20,000,000 vehicular tunnel under the Parana river.

It will link the capitals of the two important provinces of Sante Fe and Entre Rios. It will be paid off through tolls.
