Stevenson Taking Rest in Philadelphia

Philadelphia — (U.P.) — Adlai E. Stevenson rested here today from his two-day tour of Pennsylvania in the city that gave him a 160,000 plurality in 1952.

Stevenson, whose name will appear on the state Democratic primary ballot next Tuesday, arrived by plane yesterday from the state capital at Harrisburg. He started his tour in Pittsburgh at the opposite end of the state Wednesday.

Stevenson capped his drive for a big vote in the Pennsylv-

ania primary with a 15-minute statewide television appearance last night.

He criticized the Republican administration for giving the nation "statistical prosperity." He said the GOP continually claims the nation is prosperous and yet "we have a farm depression and two million families earning less than \$2000 a year."

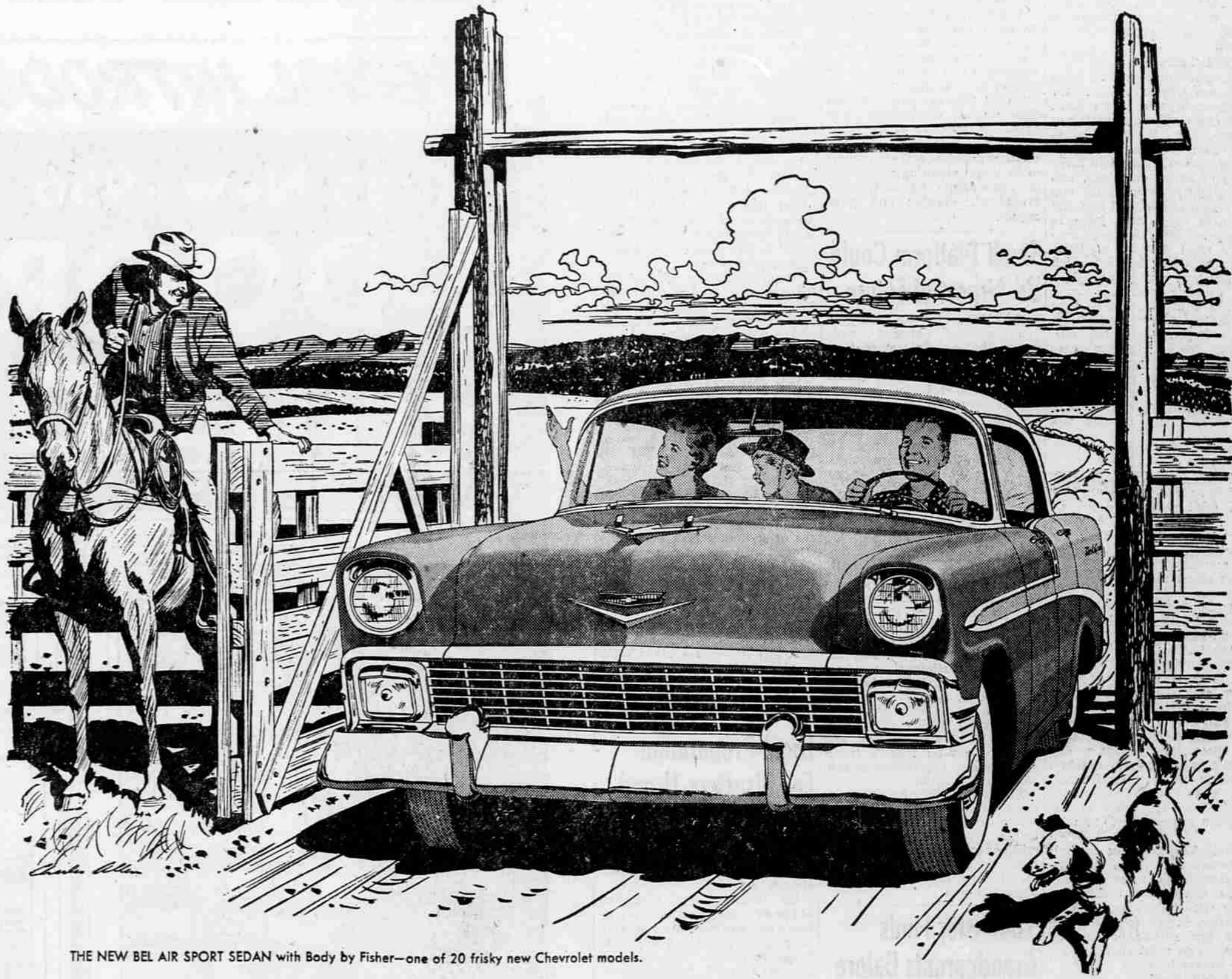
