Laglie May Decide Future Next Week

Olympia — (U.P.) — The biggest unanswered question in Washington state politics—what will Gov. Arthur B. Langlie's future be—may be answered within the next week.

In reply to questions of newsmen at Olympia, Langlie said he "hopes to have the decision settled within a week." The governor declined to hint what the decision might be.

One possibility is an announcement that he will yield to Republican pressure that he seek the U. S. Senate seat held by Democrat Warren G. Magnuson. In addition, Langlie is considered a possible successor to Douglas McKay, the resigned Interior secretary, and has not completely shut the door on running for a fourth term as governor.

Langlie privately has indicated a personal desire to retire from public office.
