The Medical Roundup

WHEN A PHYSICIAN CAN'T DIAGNOSE OR CURE

People write occasionally to scold me because a doctor they consulted could not make a diagnosis and could not cure. As I say to these unfortunate people, perhaps one in four of the people I see have no local cause for the pain in their abdomen or for the symptoms that are bothering them. I am satisfied that their distresses all come out of their tired or nervously upset brain. Often, years later, I again see one of these persons and he (or she) tells me that my diagnosis of nerves must have been right because the trouble went away without much medicine, and nothing serious ever happened.

Many highly nervous persons are much annoyed when a physician cannot find an ulcer, or cancer, or tumor, or something or other that can be cut out. Some even insist that the doctor operate; they are so sure that they have some disease in the abdomen; but they haven't. The doctor may take out the appendix, or some gallstones, but the patient will remain just as miserable as he (or she) was before. This shows that the organ that was removed was not producing the symptoms.

Many Diseases Not Curable

Another reason why doctors cannot always cure is that many diseases are not curable. To illustrate: When a man has had a stroke, a small part of his brain has been destroyed and no doctor can go into his skull and build the tissue back up again. Or, when the patient was a child he may have had an attack of rheumatic fever in which the bad germs largely destroyed one of the valves in his heart. Today, in some cases, surgeons can go into the chest cavity and operate on the valve so as to make it work better. But when such an operation is not indicated, or cannot be performed, there is little that the doctor can do except to teach the patient to live with his handicap. I could go on and fill many columns with descriptions of diseases for which there is as yet no known cure.

House Passes GI Bill For Children of Vets

Washington — (U.P.) — The House yesterday passed and sent to the Senate a bill which would give GI educational benefits to children whose fathers died as a result of service during World War II and the Korean war.

Chairman Olin E. Teague (D-Tex.), of the House Veterans committee said there are about 100,000 such orphans with average ages between 10 and 14 years. They would be entitled to 36 months of educational training in accepted schools and colleges after graduation from high school. The program would cost about \$150,000,000, Teague said.

The target: "The hat-wearers." The hat-wearers, also known as the "regulars" or "hounds," are semi-professional quiz contestants. They were spawned by radio and during the medium's peak years, they traveled in packs from studio to studio in pursuit of loot.

On radio, a competent hat-wearer could change his voice or personality and appear on as many as seven or eight giveaway shows a year. One veteran of the game is known to have boasted that she furnished her daughter's home with the prizes she carried off.

But TV is killing the species. There are only a few regulars left now, none of them very successful at the trade. TV is too searching. Show producers and Emcees realize that a regular can be spotted too easily in the visual medium.

Hats Get Attention
 The hat-wearers came by their curious name quite early in the game. The lady competitors in the pack (and most were females in their middle years) learned from the very start that a large crazy hat would attract the attention of whomever was picking contestants from the audience. They began wearing 'em with a vengeance.

In the early days of radio, the hat-wearers were welcomed at most shows. They were not miked
