Police Warn Children About Blasting Caps

Charles Champlin today cautioned children to avoid touching blasting caps they might find in the area.

Blasting caps are small, metallic cylinders about as big around as a pencil and from one to 5 1/2 inches long, he said. A cap may or may not have a fuse attached, he said. Some are bright aluminum or copper with plain or colored wires at one end. All are charged with sensitive explosives that can be set off by careless handling, shock or heat, he explained.

The caps are used in a variety of excavation projects and when they explode, bits of metal fly in all directions. Champlin said the sharp fragments can cripple or blind a child, or in extreme cases, cause death.

The police chief also cautioned adult users of blasting caps to carefully account for every one. Otherwise, he said, a mislaid cap may main or kill some youngster.
