Quotes From the News

 Paris—(U.P.)—French Foreign Minister Christian Pineau, on the decision of the Big Three powers to turn the whole Middle East problem over to the U.N. Security Council:

"The question of the arms embargo cannot be settled by the three powers alone. If the Security Council decided to promote such a measure, France would support and respect it."

Seoul, Korea—An official government statement on mob demonstrations Saturday against President Syngman Rhee:

"It is evident that the riots were instigated by anti-government elements of the opposition party."

Washington—Chairman Allen J. Ellender (D-La.) of the Senate Agricultural committee on whether he believes "the financial pinch in the farm belt" threatens a major depression:

"The producers of our food and fiber are the mainstay in our economy, and if you let them go by the board it may mean that other segments of our society will die on the vine."

Denver—John Gilbert Graham on his decision not to appeal his conviction and death penalty for the airliner dynamite bombing that killed 44 persons:

"I'm certainly not going through that ordeal (the trial) again."

Santa Barbara, Calif.—Adlai E. Stevenson, charging that "in at least six instances" high Republican officers have mixed private interests with public responsibilities:

"In view of so many cases the President's promise that influence peddlers will be 'thrown out instantly' begins to lose its flavor."

Washington—Sen. Herbert H. Lehman (D-N.Y.) charged the Eisenhower administration with distinguishing between American citizens "on a religious or national descent basis":

"Our government actively connives with the government of Saudi Arabia . . . to keep American soldiers who happen to be of Jewish faith from serving in American installations which happen to be in Saudi Arabian territory."

AF Reserve Holds 'Operation Buildup'

Under the title, "Operation Buildup," the Air Force reserve is launching during the month of May a nation wide effort to build up its combat flying wings to full readiness.

Primary goal of the buildup program is to secure the participation of qualified Air Force veterans in the training programs of reserve flying wings. Comprising 24 combat wings, there are 13 troop carrier, 9 fighter bomber and 2 tactical bomber wings in the Air Reserve flying wing program.

Targets of "Operation Buildup" are Air Force veterans with obligated reserve time, among whom are more than 12,000 selective assignees, qualified Air Force technicians, who have been assigned to vacancies in the 24 air reserve wings.
