Strawberry Marks That Fade

According to Dr. A. H. Jacobs of Stanford University, from 8 to 10 per cent of infants, soon after birth, show some where on their body a sharply outlined pale area which soon turns bright red. The surface of the lesion then rises and becomes tense and shiny. Usually, in the first three to six months of the infant's life such a strawberry mark, made up of tiny blood-vessels, develops rapidly, and then the process slows down and parts of the lesion begin to disappear. The color fades. Then spots of blue discoloration may appear in the patch. These enlarge and run together during the second year of life. Later they fade, leaving islands of normal-appearing skin. By the time a child is from 4 to 5 years of age, most of the dull red rem-



nants of the lesion have disappeared, leaving only more or less atrophic skin, which gradually acquires a normal texture, so that little remnant of the mark can be seen.

As Dr. Jacobs says, as long as this natural disappearance of the thing proceeds satisfactorily, treatment is not necessary. Meddling is inadvisable, because it can produce scarring.

NATO Members Split On American Plan

Paris—(U.P.)—Members of the North Atlantic alliance are reported sharply divided on an American plan to set up a "cabinet" to coordinate economic and political planning by the 15 member nations of NATO.

Secretary of State John Foster Dulles suggested the formation of a cabinet during the NATO conference which ended Sunday. Dulles left by plane Sunday night for Washington to report to President Eisenhower.

NATO already has a permanent council but it is concerned chiefly with military problems. It has not been able to discuss such major issues as the North Africa rebellion against France, the future of Cyprus and the explosive Middle East.

Under the American plan, the cabinet would study the problems and report back to the full council action. But some Allies were reported disturbed at prospects of NATO "interference."

Incidents Feed Fire Of Mid-West Tension

United Nations—(U.P.)—A series of small incidents kept tension alive in the Middle East yesterday despite the apparent success of U. N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold's peace mission.

Israeli announced that Jordanian infiltrators blew up a house three miles inside Israeli territory and said the tracks led across the Jordanian frontier.

An Israeli army spokesman reported that shots were fired Sunday night at a police vehicle traveling a country road well inside the Israeli borders. No casualties were reported.

In Cairo, Col. Radi Innab, chief of the Arab Legion, and Egyptian leaders announced they had set up a unified military command against Israel. The Egyptian press hailed the act as the culmination of efforts to draw Jordan into the alliance against the Baghdad Pact.
