Timing of Estes' Visit Here Worked Out By Committee

Details of timing of Senator Estes Kefauver's visit to southern Oregon next Tuesday were worked out by Jackson and Josephine committees in charge at a meeting here last night.

The Tennessee senator will spend not more than an hour in Jackson county, with his time split between the Medford airport, Ashland and Medford. He is expected to arrive by private plane from Klamath Falls at 9:45 a.m. Tuesday, May 15.

He will be met at the Medford airport by a caravan of local cars and taken to Ashland where he will make a 10-minute talk on the Plaza. After briefly meeting local officials and shaking hands with the crowd he will be taken by caravan to Medford.

Senator Kefauver will speak for 10 minutes from the county court house steps at 10:30 a.m. He will be greeted on behalf of the city by Mayor Earl Miller and will be introduced by Attorney Russell DeForest, chairman of his committee in Jackson county.

Clyde Fichtner, president of the Jackson County Democratic Social club and Democratic County Chairman Robert A. Boyer will greet Kefauver on behalf of the Democratic party here.

Miss Kay Carrara, head of the Young Democrats of Jackson county also will be present with her committee. There will be a song and dance by the "Davy Crockett" club which will present a coon-skin cap to the senator.

Senator Kefauver is due in Grants Pass for a speech and luncheon at 11:45 a.m. and in Coos Bay for a speech at 1:30 p.m. He will appear in Eugene in the evening.

Rode Charges Nunley With 'Unnecessary' Increases in Budget

George Rode, candidate for the Republican nomination for district attorney, charged incumbent Walter Nunley with an "unnecessary" 400 per cent increase of budget, an "unexplained" investigator, a bad trial record, and faulty indictments, last night during a Republican Candidate's night sponsored by the Young Republicans club in the Medford YMCA.

Allan Holmes, a deputy in the district attorney's office, spoke for Nunley, who was in Portland. Holmes said he would not reiterate any of the district attorney's statements, as he has already made himself clear in defense of his policies.

Rode said the district attorney continues to make the same mistakes he made when he began, and lacks the ability to convince juries. He said that the district attorney has insisted he was right on a case even two years after he lost it before the supreme court. In persisting to follow his own ideas Nunley must visualize the government as one of men and personalities, not one of law, Rode said.

"Therefore," he concluded, "Nunley hasn't accepted the discipline of his profession."

In quoting Nunley's record, Holmes said of 463 misdemeanors brought to court, only seven were not brought to a successful completion. Holmes added that while he has been in the district attorney's office, which is since September, he has become convinced the district attorney's office is being economically and efficiently handled.

Candidate for county commissioner, Melvin Lattie, said the reason he is running for commissioner is because he is "disgusted" with the tax situation in the county. He said the millage levy for taxes in the county is excessive and that there is no reason why the levy should increase almost a 100 per cent in a year.

City Councilman Stanley Jones, speaking for the incumbent, L. G. Morthland, answered that the policy of the county budget committee has been that the county will not obligate itself or spend more money than received. As a result, Jones said, Jackson county is one of the few counties which isn't bonded. This means that today's children will not have to pay today's bills in the future, Jones said.
