Stella—We're too old for love. George—She is too burdened.

Stella—I am a widow with two young children whose husband has been gone more than five years. I am approaching my 40th birthday and am past the age of romantic love, but I want a father for my children who can give them a good home and help with their future.

Since my husband's death I have managed to provide an existence of bare decency for my children, but I have hopes of doing a little better in the future as the children grow up and allow me to give more time to my work.

Recently, I met a man who is quite well-to-do and has talked to me about marriage. But he seems to be a very possessive man and wants me to behave as though I were a young girl deeply in love. He is at least five years older than I am, and I find it difficult to understand how he can behave like an adolescent and expect me to do the same. I would like to marry him, but I am afraid of trouble ahead.

George—Stella has had a grim time taking care of her children and doesn't really know herself. She certainly does not look as old as she talks. I am sure she would feel much differently about things if she let me take some of the burdens off her shoulders.

I want to be a father to her children, but I want even more to have her as my companion and friend. I have worked hard all my life, and now that I have reached a little independence, I want to have some of the joys of life that I have missed. I am willing to risk the future, but Stella worries too much.

The Council: Stella is right in "worrying too much." She cannot afford to have a marriage blow up in the faces of her young children. The marriage is likely to blow up if she enters it with her present attitude.

A woman of 40 should not feel that she is past the age of romantic love. She is completely unrealistic in expecting that a man of 45 will regard himself as an old man who should demand nothing of a woman but good housekeeping. Certainly, the need for affection does not lessen with the passing years.

George is unwise to take the risk of marrying a woman who does not seem to have any appreciation of his qualities and needs as a person. He may be right in guessing that Stella's personality has been repressed by her heavy burdens, but it does not follow that a brief period of financial security would make her a good wife.

Stella realizes that she needs someone to relieve her material burdens, but she does not realize

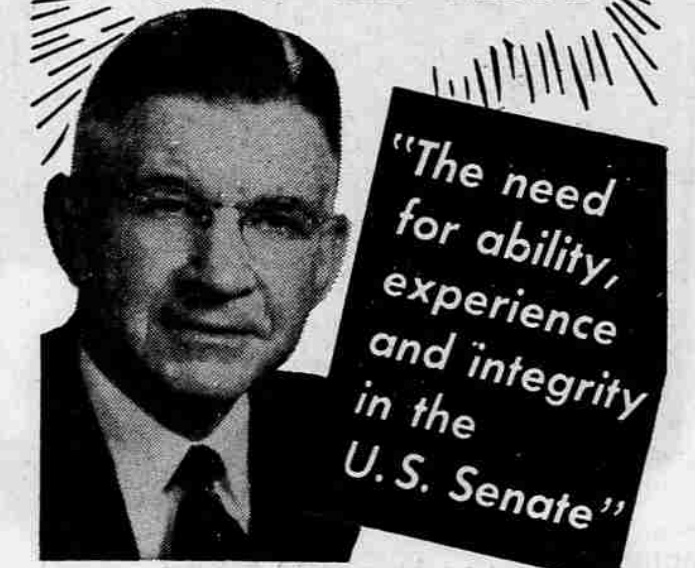

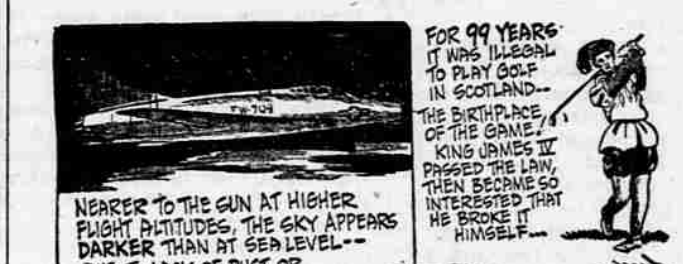
Ray Weinholt, son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Weinholt, also of Talent, has been selected salutatorian.
