A Low Blood Pressure Is Rarely a Disease
In spite of all the columns I have written on the usual harmfulness of low blood pressure, I keep constantly getting requests for information about this so-called disease. As I tell people, when I investigate a case of supposed low blood pressure...

Water Always...
I usually find a systolic or top-of-the-wave blood pressure of 110 or 115 millimeters of mercury. This is an ideal pressure. In the cases of persons past middle-age, I may find a systolic pressure of 130 or 140 mm., again ideal. I tell these persons that they are not ill or abnormal; they are just lucky and to be congratulated. They belong to a small group of very normal persons whose blood pressure remains low as long as they live.

Not Taught Pressure Limits
Why, then, do some of us doctors frighten our very lucky and healthy friends by telling them they have a low blood pressure? Because at college we were not taught the limits of normal pressure. There still is argument about them. In 1918, I did some of the first research in this subject, based on measurements made on some 15,000 university students, and I found that the persons who keep a low systolic pressure are not the sickly ones—they are the healthy ones; they are the ones who are likely to live long. This is why I never think of scaring persons who have a low pressure, and I never try to raise it. Actually, I do not know of any drug that can be counted on to raise a blood pressure and keep it up.

I know many persons who say to me, "But I feel bad when my blood pressure is low, and I feel better when it is higher." I do not know that this is true, but if it is, my hunch would be that the blood pressure falls a bit when the person is tired and...
