 Ashland — Dr. Victor P. Morris, dean of the school of business administration, University of Oregon, will deliver the commencement address at the Ashland High school graduation Wednesday, May 23, in the Ashland High gymnasium.

He will speak on "The World We See." He will be introduced by Leland P. Linn, Ashland superintendent of schools. Commencement begins at 8 p.m.

Morton Wayne Scripser will deliver the valedictory address and Gaither Bruce Evert will give the salutatory address.

The Ashland High baccalaureate will be held at 8 p.m., Sunday, May 20. The Rev. B. J. Holland, of the First Presbyterian church, Ashland, will deliver the sermon.

Mass Narcotics Raids Held in Philadelphia
 Philadelphia (U.P.)—Federal, state and local authorities staged the biggest mass narcotics raid in this city's history today, swooping down on suspected "pushers" in a pre-dawn crackdown.

Armed with 103 warrants, some 300 raiders burst into rooms, apartments and private homes throughout the city to drag sleepy-eyed suspects to police wagons and then to a special "reception center" in City Hall.

Sixty-six suspects were rounded up in the first five hours of the synchronized raids. The mass roundup stemmed from months of undercover work by local narcotics investigators.

None of the surprised suspects offered resistances. They were booked, fingerprinted and photographed and then held for hearings later today.
