A Watering of the Eyes

Many elderly persons wonder why their eyes water a little so that tears run down their cheeks. I suspect that usually there has been a little chronic inflammation of the conjunctiva, or outer lining of the eye which has tended perhaps to water the eyelids a bit so that the little tear duct at the inner corner of the eye does not fit closely enough

against the eyeball, and hence does not pick up the tears as it should. In other cases, the tear-duct is plugged up a bit, and then perhaps an ophthalmologist can pass a probe through it and dilate it enough so that it will carry the excess tears from around the eye down into the nose.

Many persons wish they had in their home a simply written and authoritative book which would give information in regard to the care of the body in health and during the several common illnesses. One of the best of such books that I have seen (The Complete Medical Guide) has just been written by Dr. Benjamin Miller, in collaboration with a number of able specialists.

Dr. Miller is one of those rare persons who is at the same time an excellent clinician, teacher and research worker, and a man who can write classic English. In this book one finds chapters on underweight and overweight, on the care of the several parts of the body, on the person's job and its relation to health, on vacations, keeping germs away, the normal mind, the slightly sick mind, and the definitely sick mind, emotional attitudes toward marriage, preparations for marriage, becoming good parents, pregnancy, childbirth, giving the baby a good start in life, children's emotions, fevers and other sicknesses of infants and children, adolescence, first aid, home-nursing, the layman's relation to his physician, medical check-ups, recognizing illness early, hospitals, surgical operations, health insurance, the killing diseases, the disabling diseases, and the nuisance ones, problems of women, and the illnesses of the later years.
