**U.S. National To Present Estate, Trust Form Here**

The U.S. National bank will present an estate and trust forum in Medford Tuesday, May 22. The forum will start at 7:30 p.m. in the Pioneer room of the Jackson hotel. Allan F. Perry, manager of the Medford branch, will preside at the meeting which will feature a four-man team from bank's head office. This is the seventh year the bank has presented the series. **Pilot Arrested for Striking Ship Mast**

Sydney, Australia — (U.P.) — Australian authorities arrested the pilot of a Royal Australian Air Force C47 cargo plane who slipped the mast of a small coastal steamer today. The pilot, flying freight from Richmond to Williamstown, came down too low over the water and struck the mast of the ship. The only damage to the plane was a scratch along the metal fuselage. Members of the ship's crew took cover when the plane struck, showering them with wreckage of the mast. The plane righted itself and flew on to a safe landing.
