Bertha—He is lavish with his children.

Nathan—I must square my conscience.

Bertha—I am married to an older man who is divorced and the father of two teen-age children. He courted me for two years, showering me with attentions and lavish gifts. I never thought I would ever have any difficulty over finances with this man, but I find I was very much mistaken.

He earns a very good salary, but he is certainly not as lavish in marriage as he was in courtship, although he seems unflinching in providing for his children.

I had thought before marriage I would want to have children, but the way he showers things on the children of the woman from whom he is divorced has frightened me, and I am still working as an office secretary.

Nathan—Bertha has misunderstood my attitude. I am not at all partial to my children and would very much want to have children with Bertha. But I do have a conscience about the two children of a bad marriage and I do not want to leave them in the lurch. They understand that I am providing for them until they can shift for themselves. In a few more years I expect to be able to keep the bulk of my earnings for my new family, which we would raise if Bertha only had a little more faith in me.

If I loved these children well enough to want to raise them in my new home, there would be less of a problem. But the truth is that I feel cold toward them and can give them nothing but financial support. If I denied them that, I could not live with myself.

The Council: Nathan is paying the price of his peculiar attitude toward his children. Had he loved them, he would have discussed their status with Bertha before marriage and there would now be no distressing disagreement.

He is trying to square his conscience by being a good provider, but he is thereby bringing bitterness into his new home, and probably planting it in his children as well. He wants to have children with his new wife, but he does not stop to consider that these children may grow up embittered by the knowledge that they share their father with two unwanted children who have been pampered financially to soothe his conscience.

Bertha's, of course, just as much at fault for having failed to discuss the children and the

financial problem before marriage. She knew she was marrying a much older man, a divorced man and the father of two children, and she should have sought a clear understanding.

Not having faced the question when she should have done so, she has no alternative now but to reconcile herself to the facts as they are. She cannot hope to build a good future on the foundation of a husband's bad conscience. She has to go along with him in his need to provide amply for his children.

If she goes along with him on this point, there is some chance that she may in time normalize his attitude. As it is, she is making the worst of a bad bargain.

Paris — (U.P.) — Harry Truman paid his respects today to World War I buddies who did not live to see the former Army captain rise to President of the United States.

He drove to Suresnes to visit the graves of soldiers with whom he served when he was captain of Battery D of the 129th Field Artillery Regiment.

His secretary, Eugene Bailey, said Mr. and Mrs. Truman might go for a sightseeing drive through Paris later in the day before entraining for Rome this evening.

The Trumans went for a half-hour drive around Paris last evening and then had dinner sent to their suite in the Hotel Bristol.

They did not get out of the car during the drive, which took them to Notre Dame Cathedral, along the left bank past the Chamber of Deputies, across the Seine to the Place de la Concorde, up to the Champs d'Elysees to the Arc De Triomphe and back through the Bois de Boulogne.

## Western States Bake as East Gets Freezing Weather

The weather baked the west side of the nation in a heat wave and chilled the east side with freezing temperatures today.

A California heat wave burned into its sixth day. It kept up a record breaking pace, setting records with a 99 in Los An-

geles and a 91 in San Francisco Wednesday.

It was 38.8 at New York City, equalling an all time low record, and 34 at Burlington, Vt., and Pittsburgh. A Christmas cactus plant burst into bloom at Owosso, Mich., when the mercury went to 33. A light snow was falling at the time.

Winds Rake Airport

Temperatures warmed up from chilly levels in the nation's midlands, but the change set off 104-mile per hour winds which raked the Grand Forks, N. D., airport.

Californians were promised some relief from their unseasonable heat, but not much. The heat caused traffic jams on Los Angeles freeways, sent thou-

sands hurrying to the beaches, and cooked up smog in the San Francisco-Oakland area.

Los Angeles found some comfort in the fact that its traditional vacationland rival, Miami, was also sizzling. The mercury got to 90 there Wednesday and broke a 40-year record.

Boyer City, Mich. — (U.P.) Donald Shay, 26, won a \$1 bet with his father-in-law as to which of them could find the first mushrooms of the season but his victory was a painful one. Shay became so excited when he found some mushrooms that he ran head on into a barbed wire fence when he dashed to show them to his father-in-law. Doctors took a dozen stitches to close cuts on Shay's face.

Nicosia, Cyprus — (U.P.) — The pro-Greek Cypriot underground bombed a British jeep in Famagusta today, killing a sergeant-major and injuring two other soldiers.

Two bombs were hurled at the jeep. One exploded inside the vehicle. The other one failed to go off.

Security forces cordoned off the area around Plutarch street where the incident took place. They arrested one man and started a search of all houses within a quarter-mile radius.
