Battery Additive Case Dismissed

Washington—(U.P.)—The government has dismissed its two-year-old false advertising case against the makers of battery additive AD-X2.

The Federal Trade Commission held Wednesday in a 4 to 0 decision that "the greater weight of evidence did not sustain the charges" against the manufacturer, Pioneer's, Inc., Oakland, Calif., and its president, Jess M. Ritchie.

The FTC ruling was based largely on the testimony of 43 satisfied users of AD-X2, who disputed scientific findings of the National Bureau of Standards that the product had no significant beneficial effect on automobile batteries.

The AD-X2 case was widely publicized in 1953 when Dr. Allen V. Astin, head of the Bureau of Standards, was ousted by Commerce Secretary Sinclair Weeks because of the bureau's findings.

Weeks claimed the bureau had not been sufficiently objective in testing the merits of the battery booster. Astin's dismissal drew angry protests from scientific circles and he finally was reinstated after a congressional investigation.

Colorful Rites Honor Archbishop

Portland—(U.P.)—At colorful ceremonies here yesterday, hundreds of communicants and prelates honored the Most Rev. Edward D. Howard, archbishop of the archdiocese of Portland, in a solemn pontifical high mass of thanksgiving commemorating the 50th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood.

Some 1500 communicants and 300 prelates were in attendance at the ceremonies as were His Eminence James Francis Cardinal McIntyre of Los Angeles, 21 bishops, five abbots, a superior general, seven provincials and many monsignors.

Most Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara, of Kansas City, Mo., the oldest living priest ordained for his archdiocese, gave the sermon at the service. He saluted Archbishop Howard "affectionately and reverently for his long years of distinguished and fruitful service as the senior archbishop in the United States."

Disc Jockey Marries Egyptian Sweetheart

Cairo, Egypt—(U.P.)—A California disc jockey and the girl he wooed by letter and tape recorder were married in a civil service ceremony today.

American radio announcer Carol Pedersen, 27, Pasadena, Calif., and his Egyptian sweetheart, Laurence Shaker, 23, exchanged their vows before a notary public.


They did not exchange rings, preferring to wait for the religious ceremony which is scheduled in the Anglican All Saints cathedral here May 27.

Pedersen and Miss Shaker carried on their romance by mail. They started their correspondence when her brother visited Pedersen in the United States and described her in glowing terms. Pedersen became interested and started the series of letters which led him to propose and then come to Cairo.

When he reached here a couple of weeks ago, he said Miss Shaker was even more beautiful than he imagined.
