Salem — (U.P.) — The State Wage and Hour Commission today called a public meeting in Portland Monday to consider revision of the minimum wage, maximum work week and other regulations governing the employment of women and minors in public housekeeping occupations.

The legal minimum presently stands at 85 cents an hour with a maximum eight-hour day and 44-hour week, according to Labor commissioner Norman O. Nilsen.

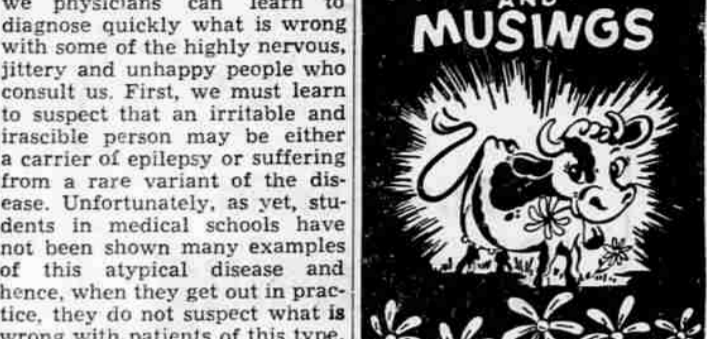

Postal Rate Hike Gets Tentative OK

Washington — (U.P.) — The House Post Office Committee has voted tentatively to increase postal rates for newspapers and magazines. The increases would be spread over five years.

The Committee, meeting in closed session, also voted the 30 per cent increase for third class mail as recommended by the Post Office Department.

The Committee was to consider today administration recommendations to increase first class letters from three to four cents and air mail from six to seven cents. After that, the Committee will vote on the entire bill again.

It would increase rate on reading material in newspapers and magazines from the present 1.95 cents a pound to 2.5 cents a pound over the five-year period.

It would increase the rates on advertising material in the publications from the present 1.95 cents a pound to 4.3 cents, with the 4.3-cent rate applying to the farthest zones.
